

Registration Information 2018-2019

We have now reached the August 1st deadline for religious education registration. The fee paid after August 1, is \$100.00 per student – not to exceed \$175.000 per family. Fees may be paid by check (payable to St. George Church) or cash. There is an additional \$35.00 fee for each student entering Grade Two or Confirmation. Registration fee payment must be made at time of Registration. Once the Registration Fee is received, your child will be assigned to a class.
