From Your Pastor

In these times when there just seems to be so much divisiveness in our country, our world and sometimes even in our Church, we need to hear the words of our late Holy Father, St. John Paul II, taken from his encyclical, *Dives in Misericordia* (*Rich in Mercy*), where he says the following: "Society can become 'ever more human' only when we introduce into all human relationships which form its moral aspect the moment of form

when we introduce into all human relationships which form its moral aspect the moment of forgiveness, which is so much of the essence of the Gospel. Forgiveness demonstrates the presence in the world of the love which is more powerful than sin. Forgiveness is also the fundamental condition for reconciliation, not only in the relationship of God with man, but also in relationships between people. A world from which forgiveness was eliminated would be nothing but a world of cold and unfeeling justice, in the name of which each person would claim his or her own rights vis-a-vis others; the various kinds of selfishness latent in man would transform life and human society into a system of oppression of the weak by the strong, or into an arena of permanent strife between one group and another. For this reason, the Church must consider it one of her principal duties...to proclaim and to introduce into life the mystery of mercy.

Spiritual Support for those with Cancer

Feeding the Hungry

We continue to collect non-perishable food items throughout the summer. This food is given to our local food pantry which is held at the Unitarian Church on the corner of Shore Drive and Brattle Street and is called "Loaves and Fishes". St. George church and several other churches on Brattle Street help to run this food pantry- which is also supported through the Worcester County Food Bank. Food is delivered by a parish family and is usually set up the third Friday evening of the month at about 6PM and distributed the third Saturday morning of the month at about 9AM till 11 AM. We also donate, as needed, to the Mustard Seed on Piedmont Street in Worcester. This food is shared with about 25 neighboring families in need. Our next Mustard Seed Meal is September 16, 2017. Needs will be posted at the beginning of the month.

The Donations Clearinghouse

DCH collects furniture and household goods to help families and individuals leaving shelters and transitional housing. They also help people with limited fixed incomes those who have suffered from fire or flood, victims of domestic violence and the elderly. Items desperately needed are: dressers and bureaus, lamps, kitchen tables and chairs, night stands, end tables and coffee tables, twin size mattress sets.
