

Registration Information 2018-2019

We have now reached the August 1st deadline for religious education registration. The fee paid after August 1, is \$100.00 per student – not to exceed \$175.000 per family. Fees may be paid by check (payable to St. George Church) or cash. There is an additional \$35.00 fee for each student entering Grade Two or Confirmation. Registration fee payment must be made at time of Registration. Once the Registration Fee is received, your child will be assigned to a class.

During halftime, the high school basketball coach was trying to motivate his team as they struggled to stay in the game. "You're not really trying," he said, "you're just going through the motions. But once He recovers and is strengthened by the Holy Spirit, Peter will be the first to proclaim the Gospel and the first to lead the Church,

If you struggle, you are on the right path. Don't worry about 'spiritual' trends in society or how loudly others may speak out against all that is holy.
