



### A Letter from Bishop Mc Manus

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we watched Hurricane Harvey ravage the communities on the Gulf Coast, who could have imagined that Hurricane Irma would be immediately on its heels with one of the worst storms in history bringing devastation to so much of the Caribbean and parts of Florida. The scenes coming to us in the media in recent days are somber and our hearts go out to so many people whose lives, whose homes, and whose livelihoods have been crushed by this disaster.

Once again, we are called to respond. I ask that we join with Catholic Dioceses around our nation in taking up a second collection for relief work in the Caribbean and Florida. Dear Friends,

For the past few weeks I have been away in Ireland. I originally went for a brief visit with an old friend but ended up extending my stay due to a health issue. I have returned healthy and delighted that my friend and I were able to spend a good amount of time together and I had a little extra time for reflection.

As many of you know, over 40 years ago I was a nurse in a rural mission hospital in Sierra Leone. West Africa. During those years, my Irish friend was a Holy Rosary Sister and the doctor in charge of that hospital. Since then, Sr. Hilary and I have stayed in touch and gotten together quite often despite the miles between us. During this visit there were many opportunities to reminisce and reflect on the experience of service together. Ironically, my cell phone continued to be connected to our current Confirmation Candidates here at St. George's and I received many emails with their reflections on the summer service they recently experienced. Unexpectedly, I began to see a connection between the community work which, for me, began long ago in Africa and the community work I am currently involved in here. Teaching young mothers to prevent malnutrition in an African village is not that different from making and sharing healthy meals with the families at the June Street shelter. Lately I have been working on plans to upgrade the lavatories at the Mustard Seed; in Africa I was working with villagers to dig pit latrines! In Africa I'd learn and pray with the people and here with you, I am still learning and praving!


So with time to reflect and count many blessings, I am in awe of the gift of service and the privilege of being able to continue it for many years, in many ways, and in many places. I have always received so much more than I am able to give and learn so more than I am able to teach.
