

Fall Mustard Seed News and Needs

Last Friday night at the Mustard Seed the cool weather was making itself felt by the homeless folks who are sleeping out in abandoned buildings and wooded areas.

I walked in with a few sweatshirts in my arms and they disappeared in a moment. The socks in my bag were gone in a flash. People lined up for the scarves, hats and toiletries bags that a generous and creative parishioner put together. Everyone said "thank you". I heard an elderly man say he hadn't had socks for weeks. A young girl was so delighted to have a shampoo sample. I was happy to help some and sad to have a shortage to give to all who were asking.

One of the guests brought a plate of the evening meal out to a man in a wheel chair. You would have been moved with compassion to see him eat so quickly that he didn't even pause between bites!

It was Friday night and the line continued untill every bit of food was given away. On the weekends the Mustard Seed and St. John's Food for the Poor is closed so people are eager to collect and save what food they can for Saturday and Sunday. A few downtown churches serve sandwiches and there is often an evangelical street ministry on Main Street that gives out some food on Saturday mornings.

Several folks asked if there were any blankets or sleeping bags but unfortunately there were none. If you have any to spare please leave them in the Outreach Collection Area inside the parking lot door to the church - at the foot of the steps. Sweatshirts and tee shirts continue to be needed.
