

From Your Pastor

On Saturday, December 15th, at 10:00 A.M. Sagar Gundiga (our seminarian from the summer of 2017) will be ordained to the Diaconate at St. Paul's Cathedral. He will be assisting and preaching at his First Mass of Thanksgiving as a Deacon here at St. George's on Sunday, December 16th, at the 11:00 A.M. Mass. A reception will follow in the church hall. This information is being given to you now so that you can mark your calendars. Since no one from his family in his native India will be able to attend his Diaconate Ordination and Mass of Thanksgiving, I hope that many of you - his parish family - will plan on attending these two joyous celebrations.

Next Sunday we will celebrate the beginning of the Season of Advent which is also the beginning of our Church's liturgical year. This year we will be in the C cycle of the liturgical year when we will hear the Gospel of Luke proclaimed through most of the year. Advent is a Latin word which means coming or arrival. Advent is a season when we celebrate three arrivals of Christ: his lowly birth of the past, his mysterious coming to the Christian community in the present and his promised return as our judge at the end of time. Advent was originally celebrated as a type of "Lent" during the forty days before the feast of Christmas. Gradually Advent developed its own distinctive character, retaining a slight penitential dimension from Lent but emphasizing more of our joy-filled hope at the coming of the Lord.

This year, we will offer a prayer initiative on our parish website where each day parishioners will offer a two or three minute Advent prayer, scripture reading and reflection. Its purpose is to help us, in the spirit of the Advent season, to prepare well for the birth of Jesus. Pray with us this Advent!

Once again, we will also make available a special Advent/Christmas flyer which will be found at the entrances of the church. This flyer will bring us through the four Sundays of Advent as well as what else will be offered during this season. It will also contain the Mass schedule for Christmas and the other major feasts and solemnities that are celebrated in the Christmas season. Please be sure to take a copy of this flyer with you.

Saturday, December 8th, is the Immaculate Conception and a Holyday of Obligation. Masses will be on Friday at 6:30 P.M. and Saturday at 8:00 A.M.


Gentle Yoga


