

#### From Your Pastor

A parishioner mentioned to me that attendance at Holy Mass this year may need some clarification as we approach the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas. This year, the 4th Sunday of Advent is celebrated by the Church on the afternoon of December 23rd and the morning of the 24th. Masses for the 4th Sunday of Advent are at 4:00 P.M. on Saturday and 7:30 & 9:00 A.M. on Sunday. There is NO 11:00 A.M. Mass on Sunday, December 24th, so as to allow us to change our environment in the church - and in our hearts - from Advent to Christmas. The celebration of Christmas begins on the afternoon of December 24th and continues into the morning of the 25th. As good disciples of the Lord, we are called upon to be good stewards of all good gifts that God gives to us, and this is true of our gift of time. We need to bring our journey through Advent to its conclusion by attending Mass before we begin our celebration of Christmas at Mass. Attendance at Mass is not just an obligation but something we should want to do because of who we are as God's people - Catholic Christians. Therefore, we will be attending Mass once between the afternoon of December 23rd and the morning of December 24th and once again on either the afternoon of December 24th or the morning of December 25th.

Like last year, in order to avoid excessive overcrowding in the church building as well as to avoid a serious parking problem in the church parking lot and the surrounding streets (especially Rochelle Street) on December 24th in the afternoon, we are offering a second Mass that afternoon at 4:30 P.M. at St. Peter-Marian High School. We are very grateful to Mr. Christopher Cummings, the President of St. Peter-Marian, and the rest of the high school staff for letting us use this facility and its parking area which accommodates approximately 250 vehicles. Therefore, in anticipation of Christmas, I want to mention that the Mass schedule for this holyday is as follows:
