

### From Your Pastor

In ten days we will begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. With this Ash Wednesday and all Ash Wednesdays in the years to come, all parishes

in the Diocese of Worcester will be taking up a collection for Priest Retirement. This collection will help to supplement revenues that are collected from the endowment of the Legacy of Hope campaign, the annual Partners in Charity appeal, the assessment to parishes for Priest Retirement, the 1% of the Cathedraticum (Diocesan Tax to parishes) that is used for Priest Retirement and the annual Celebrate Priesthood Program held in October. Without this collection our Diocese of Worcester will continue to operate in a deficit to fund Priest Retirement. We realize that making an appeal of this type is challenging in these difficult times brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, but in any way that you can support this collection, your generosity will be greatly appreciated.

On Monday evening, March 1st, we will hold the first of a four-session Bible Study for Lent, entitled Sip, Snack and Scripture. During these four sessions, we will study the Letter to the Hebrews (Selected passages are used closer to and during Holy Week). This Bible Study will take place virtually from 7:00 - 8:30 P.M. The other three sessions will take place on March 8th, 15th, & 22nd. You can provide your own refreshments for "Sip & Snack". All are welcome to attend.

Virtual Faith-Sharing for Men: Over a year ago, Fr. Nally, when he was our senior priest, began a faithsharing group for men during Advent (2019) and Lent (2020) before the COVID-19 pandemic struck. This year during Lent, it is my plan to have this faith -sharing group during Lent but virtually on Saturdays from 8:00-9:00 A.M. 





### The Spiritual Growth Committee met on Monday, January, 25th:

Andrea Svagdys-Gumbrell and Bonnie Moran presented the final draft of the survey of parishioners to be administered within the next few weeks. The survey, to be completed either on line or on paper, will help Fr. Niccolls and the Spiritual Growth Committee plan future activities, especially during the duration of the COVID-induced limitations.

Lenten spiritual activities will include daily reflections from a brochure that will be inserted into the bulletin on the weekend of Feb. 13/14; a Bible Study conducted by Fr. Niccolls on the Letter to the Hebrews on four Monday evenings in March from 7 – 8:30 pm via ZOOM (March 1, 8, 15 and 22); a Lenten Evening of Recollection (with confessions) on Tues., Mar. 23 at 6:30 pm; confessions on Tues., Mar. 30 at 6:30 pm.; and Stations of the Cross available on the website every Friday in Lent.

Fr. Niccolls and the Committee are talking about an outreach to parishioners on the topic of death and dying: How will St. George parish support you when you lose a loved one? How can St. George parish, in conjunction with your preferred funeral director, help you pre-plan your funeral? What does it mean to "live well" and "die well"? What does the Church teach about cremation?

Fr. Niccolls and the Committee are talking about responding to an invitation from Fr. Donato Infante, Director of the Office of Vocations, to form a Vocations Team at St. George's.

Andrea reported that after a year of COVID-induced inactivity, the Friday Faith Sharing Group has resumed meeting. They are doing so virtually.

Spiritual Growth Committee members are: Deacon Paul – Chair; Andrea Svagdys-Gumbrell; Joyce Purcell; Joan Talbot; Bonnie Moran; Patty Walsh; and Kyle Lewandowski.

Fr. Niccolls and Fr. DaSilva serve as ex officio members.



to illustrate it? It is like a tiny
mustard seed. Though this is one
of the smallest of seeds, it grows
to become one of the largest of
plants, with long branches where
birds can come and find shelter."
Mark 4:30-32

Dear Friends,

A recent weekday Gospel was the parable of the mustard seed. The following was a reflection on that Gospel, given by Bishop Robert Barron. It reminded me of you and the ways that you work, as God works, reaching out to those in need - helping to make "God's Kingdom come".

Bishop Barron said,

"How does God tend to work? From the very small to the very great - and by a slow, gradual process. God tends to operate under the radar, on the edges of things, quietly, clandestinely, not drawing attention to himself.

C.S. Lewis speaks to this principle. How, he asks, did God enter history? Quietly, in a forgotten corner of the Roman Empire, sneaking behind enemy lines. How was European Christianity established? Through the handful of people that listened to St. Paul in Philippi and Athens. How did the mighty Franciscan movement come to be? One odd, mystical kid who heard a voice coming from a crucifix: "Francis, rebuild my Church, which is falling into ruin." A handful of followers joined him in his quixotic project, then dozens, then hundreds, then thousands.

So don't be afraid to do small things at the prompting of God! Plant the seed, make the move, take the risk-take even the smallest step, and don't worry about who notices or how much attention you're getting. Sow the seed and leave the rest to the mercy and providence of God."

As I see it, so many of you sow these seeds every day!

I find the thoughtful treats that you leave, cookies in the bag of groceries you donate to the food pantry. I find <u>cases</u> of new towels for the shelter and so many cans of tuna fish I can hardly lift the bag! You donate not one Giving Tree gift but a half dozen! You knit Prayer Shawls for years and you always donate the yarn along with your labor and prayers. There is a need for warm winter clothing and in a few days the Outreach Collection Area is filled with everything that's needed. In the middle of this worldwide pandemic you are donating so much food that we are now able to even share some with the Urban Missionaries food pantry!

You continue to sell, buy and send grocery cards for families in need. You always ask, "What do you need?". "How can I help?" You sew scarves, knit hats, buy soup and cereal, donate meals, teach Religious Ed classes for years, serve as ushers and Ministers of Holy Communion for decades, and send incredibly generous donations for folks in need. You sing for all of us when Covid precautions sadly silence us. You make videos and take pictures, You shop for elderly neighbors and bake for grieving families. And so much more!

As I see it, you - the parishioners of St. George Parish, work as God works. Quietly and carefully you plant seeds of love and kindness....abundantly, faithfully and generously!




