



The Road to Emmaus

An important reality is revealed to us in today's gospel. When others remind us of Jesus' words in the scriptures, it can touch and in fact move our hearts. This is what happened in today's gospel reading. Downhearted followers of Jesus were returning home after his crucifixion. A stranger approached them, and hearing their story, he reminded them of the words of Jesus in the scriptures, that all this had to take place before he would come back risen.

It is likewise true for ourselves when we hear the words of Jesus from a Sunday gospel or his words are quoted to us by another person. It can, like in today's gospel, touch our hearts and often times inspire and motivate us to act in a new way. By His words we are given hope and an awareness that our Lord is with us in spite of our failings, questions, and doubts. This is what happened in today's gospel story.

At times whether we are happy and filled with joy or where we may become downhearted as often happens in life, the words, the sayings, the teachings of Jesus are meant personally for us. They lift our spirits, they point the way and remind us that our Lord is with us.

The words of Jesus are meant for us, "do not let your hearts be troubled, have faith in God and faith in me". "I am the way, the truth and the life. Whoever believes in me will live."

From Your Pastor

First of all, I want to thank you for your generosity in sending in all your donations for the parish offertory, Easter and the other parish collections. This has greatly helped in meeting our parish payroll, our expenses to our parish vendors and utilities and other expenses like the health insurance payment for your priests. These acts of kindness are very much appreciated!

One morning as I was praying the daily Office of Readings, I paused to reflect upon these words taken from the Second Reading for this part of the Liturgy of the Hours which said the following: "Strengthen your heart, then, by receiving this bread as spiritual bread, and bring joy to the face of your soul. May purity of conscience remove the veil from the face of your soul so that be contemplating the glory of the Lord, as in a mirror, you may be transformed from glory to glory in Christ Jesus our Lord. To him be glory for ever and ever." In these days, when we have not been able to gather to worship as a family of faith and receive our Lord in the sacrament of His Body and Blood, we are reminded of how special a gift we have been given in this sacrament and how we long for it when we are unable to receive him. It is all the more important and necessary for us to stay close to our Lord by making a spiritual communion as often as possible. A spiritual communion, recommended by the saints for centuries, is a prayer professing faith in Jesus presence in the Eucharist and inviting him to live in our hearts. You make a spiritual communion by beginning with an examination of your conscience and making a good Act of Contrition. Then you pray one of the prayers recommended by the saints for inviting Christ into your heart. Here is a prayer given to us by St. Alphonsus Liguori:

"My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament.

I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul.

Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually

into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there, and unite

myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you.

Amen."

As I have mentioned before, this type of communion can never replace receiving our Lord Jesus in Holy Communion at Mass, but it can help us to stay close to Jesus in this Most Blessed Sacrament of His Body and Blood in these extraordinary times.


Prayers for the Sick

A new tent is now on loan to help protect the guests from the rain and sun!


Several picnic tables will be moved under the tent to provide this temporary shelter where guests can eat their evening meal. Of course there is social distancing in line and only two guests per table at one time.


