

"God Must Be First Served!"

Next weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came down upon Jesus's apostles to guide, inspire and stand with them in living and speaking the good news of salvation to the world. The Holy Spirit was for them then and now for us God's gift to us to energize, empower and impart peace to us, and to let us know we do not work alone in doing God's work.

Next Saturday we also remember a valiant young teenager who prayed many times each day, while working on her family farm, for an end to the war her country was a part of. She spoke to the King and volunteered to be a soldier. Inspired by her, the King allowed her to be a part of a major battle in Orleans between France and Spain. Before the battle, she had some soldiers shoot arrows to an area aside of the oppositions' camp. Each arrow had a message attached to it encouraging them to cease fighting. It did not happen but repeated it many times before the war's end. The girl was captured and after a court hearing was burnt at the stake before the war's end. Her name is Saint Joan of Arc.

She is remembered for her faith and courage in trying to stop the war. She is often remembered for proclaiming 'God must be first served.' And as she was dying at the stake the onlookers heard her often calling out Jesus's name.

In these now troubling times as we endure a pandemic, let us know the Holy Spirit is with us to inspire and keep us strong in being Christ's faithful helpers in this world. As we begin each day may the words of Saint Joan of Arc remind us that "God must be first served" and that Saint Joan of Arc stands with us.


