

July 11, 2021 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today, we hear of Jesus sending his Apostles out on their first missionary journey. He is specific as to what they are to

take on this trip. They will have to trust in the Lord and depend upon the hospitality of those with whom the share the Gospel. Like the Apostles, we, too, are called to be disciples of Jesus and to make disciples for Jesus by virtue of our baptism. When we accept that call, we then have our challenging work set out before us. One in three people in our country do not profess Christianity, nor do one in three people in the world. The task before us is to spread the faith by word and example as the Apostles did, trusting in the Lord and in the kindness of strangers. To be an intentional disciple requires devotion, perseverance and persistence. The prophet Amos exemplified all these traits when he opposed Amaziah, the high priest of Bethel and an advisor to the king at that time. Jeroboam II. Amaziah despised Amos and wanted him expelled, never to prophesy again. Although he was banished and censored, Amos did not stop prophesying. He called God's people to repentance. God, who is always faithful, did not give up either, telling Amos, "Go, prophesy to my people. At the end of Mass, we are given the same instruction, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." Not everyone will listen, but for those who do listen, the word of God changes everything.

This weekend is the last time that the parish bulletins will be delivered to homes in our parish since the time that the Covid-19 pandemic began. Now that restrictions have been lifted by both the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Diocese of Worcester, bulletin deliveries have significantly decreased, and those who are either homebound or not well enough to come to church will now join the households who have the bulletins mailed to them.

At the community college, a local band put on a mini-concert to publicize their upcoming appearance. They performed over the lunch hours in the cafeteria. Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters

In the summer of 1984, Mark Hatfield, a Republican senator from Oregon who had a reputation for independence and integrity, came under suspicion in an ethics investi-

gation. Henri writes to Hatfield about how to handle the injustice and pain of being unfairly accused.

This is Part II of his letter. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):


Dear Senator Hatfield,

...As you know so well, the great temptation of every human being and – I dare to say - especially of a politician is to let his identity be determined by the people who surround him, support him, vote for him, etc. The truth is that we are not who people say we are – good or bad – but we are people infinitely loved by God even though we are sinners. To this truth you have to return over and again. In these months your greatest temptation is to be only concerned to prove your "enemies" that they are wrong in what they say of you. The more you fight your enemies, the greater the danger is to get caught in their nets...I urge you to cling to the Lord in a very special way.

Your true name is the name God has given to you, and no human being can take that name away from you...You might or might not be able to convince others of your integrity, and it might be that you will have to suffer a very painful alone-ness in which you have no other company than the Lord himself. Do not be afraid for that.

Look at Him when He remains silent before Pilate. Look at Him too when he remains obedient to his Father in the knowledge that the Father will never leave him alone ...


