

# From Your Pastor

Very often in my ministry as a priest, I get questions about the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. I share with you some thoughts about this Sacrament from our Pope Emeritus, Pope Benedict XVI, which actually is a good catechesis regarding this Sacrament and when one might receive it. Here is what Pope Benedict has to say:

"The anointing of the sick is meant to help with a spiritual process that in some circumstances can become a process of healing. This is the Church's sacramental help in the situation of illness. It's less a matter of the moment of death. In that case, the true Viaticum is the Eucharist....The anointing of the sick is more a help toward an acceptance of suffering. It is meant to help me, by lifting up my pain and suffering into Christ, to enter into sacramental fellowship with him. This is not necessarily a matter of physical healing. For illness can indeed heal me spiritually; I may even have spiritual need of it. Christ. by teaching me how to suffer and by suffering with me, may truly become my doctor, who overcomes the deep spiritual sickness within my soul."







# Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters



In the summer of 1984, Mark Hatfield, a Republican senator from Oregon who had a reputation for independence and integrity, came under suspicion in an ethics investigation. Henri writes to Hatfield about how to handle the injustice and pain of being unfairly accused.

This is Part III of his letter. (from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Senator Hatfield.

... I realize that this is one of the hardest periods of your life, since one tries to do harm to you in the center of your being. But it also is the true hour of faith and fidelity. It is time of dying with Christ. It is dark and lonely, but when you know that your heart is united with the heart of Christ the powers of darkness will not destroy you. If within a few months you will be re-elected and all investigations will have restored your full honor, you can be very grateful but do not have to be exuberant saying: "I always told you so." But if you will not be re-elected and not receive the satisfactory response you expect. you may feel sad but do not have to become depressed, resentful or bitter. In both situations you can become more compassionate, that is, a man who suffers with Christ and thus gains the life that even death cannot destroy ...


