

Henri writes to his friend Barb, who cares for troubled family members and struggles with guilt, anger and desolation.

(from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Barb,

...God became a weak, broken, agonizing, lonely, rejected human being so that we could be with God as we are with people who need us...Do not focus so much on the powerful God "up there." but on the God with us. Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus always, and you will find comfort and consolation. God does not leave you alone. He sent Jesus to you to live and feel fully your struggle. 
Confirmation classes will begin October 24 and will meet throughout the year on Sundays immediately following the 10:00am Mass until12:15 p.m.

The pastor visited the junior high students in religious education class to discuss their notion of faith. He asked them if they knew what he meant if he said that faith is more than a great idea. After a bit of silence, one student said, "I think that means we have to do stuff." Stuff might not be a theological word, but it is exactly what we need to do. Faith is a way of life, not just a way to think.

St. Paul gives a great description of one way we practice the discipline of faith. He tells the Ephesians to get rid of bitterness, malice and anger and be kind to others, showing compassion and love. Forgiving others as Christ forgives us will help us imitate God and allow us to follow the way of love. It pretty much sums up the "stuff" that faith can move us to do. After all, the goal of faith is to make us more like Christ, who gave His life for all.

Make it a point to practice your faith. Be considerate of others in the parking lot, at the store and in your own home. Try to see things from someone else's point of view and resolve your differences. Don't make a big deal out of other's faults and try to be as patient and gentle as you can be. The change will amaze you and you will see just how great this "faith stuff" can be!

Letter from Bishop Mc Manus

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

"Restore the Church – Build the Future" is the theme for the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe (CCEE) which will be taken up in our diocese on the weekend of August 8. Your donation supports strengthening Catholic education, charitable programs and development of new lay leaders in 28 countries.

The worldwide coronavirus outbreak restricted nonessential travel across the globe. Stay-at-home orders, physical distancing, and quarantine practices implemented to mitigate the spread of the disease revealed great and urgent needs, especially in those countries of Eastern Europe still in turbulent transition stages. There, weak economies were made more vulnerable, and those affected included the elderly as well as doctors, nurses, and medical chaplains. In Ukraine, the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church (UGCC) came to the assistance of homebound senior citizens in many cities, using Church facilities to organize the work and engaging both local volunteers and assistance from abroad. Using the Lviv Patriarchal Center kitchen, volunteers prepared meals and delivered them to needy seniors throughout the city. In addition, the UGCC mobilized its network of about 120 hospital chaplains and collected and distributed badly needed protective clothing, masks, sanitizer, and other necessities to ensure their safety as they ministered to the sick throughout the country.

"When you know that someone cares about you and that you are not alone in your struggles," said Fr. Volodomyr Malchyn of the UGCC, "it is much easier to go through all kinds of challenges." Your participation in the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe expresses your care and support for the people in Ukraine and throughout the region, especially in times of crisis and disruption.




