

#### Faith makes us fight for what we believe

he woman insisted. Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters. Then Jesus said to her

in reply, O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish. And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour." (Matthew 15: 27-28)

I have one brother, Paulo Junio, who is younger than me. One day, Paulo Junio and I were talking about the way our mother loves us, then he said that our mother had more love for me than for him. Our mother saw that my brother and I were arguing with each other. Realizing this, she severely imposed the end of our discussion. She asked my brother and I to go to the bakery and buy one loaf of bread. "Only one bread!", she said.

As soon as we returned from the bakery, mom cut the bread into slices and said to my brother, "get the most delicious slice." My brother, looking at the slices of bread, was unable to choose. Then our mother. showing me the slices, said, "get the most delicious slice." Smart. I replied, "Mom, how can I choose the most delicious slice? The bread is the same!" "Finally, you both understood the lesson!", she said. Our mother's lesson to us: we understood that the slices of bread are the same bread, so is our mother's love to us. It is different for each of one of us, but it is always the same love.

In this sense, my brother and I understand that our mother's love introduces us to the mystery of God's love. God loves us infinitely and dedicates a very personal love to each one of us that remains the same.

A Canaanite woman pleaded with Jesus for her daughter, who was tormented by a demon. The manner in which Jesus treated her might make many of us be horrified. We never imagine that Jesus would tell someone that he had been sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel, and that it is not acceptable to take the children's bread to throw it to the dogs (see Matthew 15:21-28).

The most beautiful part of this story is the Canaanite woman's response to Jesus. She replied to Him, "It is true, Lord; 'for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters'. In other words, crumbs are also bread.

The Canaanite woman humbly accepted to be called "dogs." A word that came from Jesus' mouth. But she argued with him in order to overcome the idea of being excluded by others. With faith, we too can overcome the trials which afflict us throughout our life.

The Canaanite woman teaches us that only faith gives us access to God's love. Why do we get discouraged so easily? Why doesn't our faith lead us to resist our own circumstances, which often keep us away from God's love? We must recognize that, in the plan of salvation, God wants all people to know his love.
