

From Your Pastor

Two weeks ago we listened to Peter's misadventure as he was invited by Jesus to walk on the water toward him. There is an important lesson about discipleship in this Gospel, particularly in the necessity to stand firm in our faith in the midst of life's trials. At the time of Jesus winds and storms were associated not only with physical phenomena but with other phenomena like chaos and death. This image of the wind-and-wave battered boat with the disciples has often been portrayed as a symbol of us, the Church. Who could say that they have not been challenged by such trials during this time of pandemic or in the pursuit of justice for all people? When we find ourselves in such stormy situations, we can prevail and grow stronger in our faith at times and at other times we falter. Times of testing and adversity can show us where we are in our spiritual development and where we need to grow in Christian maturity. When Peter took his eyes off Jesus and looked at the stormy sea, he had good reason to be frightened. There are situations in life that can cause us dismay and alarm if we allow ourselves to dwell on them. When we focus on Jesus, we will view our concerns in their proper perspective. Just as Jesus did not let Peter drown in the midst of personal trial, so he will show himself to be patient with us. He will not let us perish from our every mistake nor abandon us in our struggles. He is always there with his hand stretched out to us, ready to lift us up again. The challenge is to not let distraction and doubt take us away from our goal in Jesus. Our faith is always growing and can become stronger. Like Peter and all of Jesus' disciples, we will always have the need to cry out to Jesus, "Lord, save me!"

Whoever believes in Jesus as the path that leads to God, is called to follow Him in solidarity caring for the marginalized of the world. The answer for the question "Who do you say that I am?" is simple if we base it on solidarity among people who promote human dignity in defense of life.




