

From Your Pastor

Next weekend our second collection will be for the Mission Cooperative Appeal. It has been two years since we have taken up this collection because last year we

were in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic and no one from any missionary order or community was allowed to come and speak to us on behalf of this annual appeal. I felt that since there had been a hiatus in this appeal, it would be a good time to think about what it truly means to support this appeal. To do this I am enlisting the help of a member of the Maryknoll community, Fr. Joseph Veneroso, who has recently written an article for Maryknoll magazine. entitled "The Spirit of Mission, Missioner vs. Missionary." In his article Fr. Veneroso states when we hear the word "Missionary", we probably think of a knock on the door and two well-dressed strangers asking if we have been saved, or of someone with a bible, asking if we have accepted Jesus as our personal savior. Today, the type of person - priest, religious or layperson - who is involved in the work of the missions is one who Fr. Veneroso says would most likely see themselves as a "missioner." The difference between being a missioner from being a missionary, he says, is perhaps seen best in the distinction of understanding the difference between proselytizing and evangelizing. One who proselytizes most likely sees others as objects to be converted to Catholicism through baptism, whether or not they encounter the reality of Christ in their lives. This was the thinking for centuries among missionaries and ordinary people who saw the work of missionaries as a motivation to save souls. Conversion in this manner often meant a change of religion but not necessarily a change of heart. One who evangelizes is a missioner who recognizes and respects others as partners on a spiritual journey. They are invited into the Reign of God as defined and inaugurated by the teachings, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This means that the missioner walks, works, lives and sometimes dies with those whom they evangelize as they encounter Christ in the culture of these people as well as in the Church. As one Maryknoll sister referred to this approach, she said, "I understand in a deeper way that we are sent to people of other religious beliefs, not to bring God to them, but to help them find a loving God within them."

With these thoughts in mind, the Second Collection next weekend, October 2nd/3rd, will be taken up for the work of the Dominican Fathers & Brothers in Nigeria. Fr. Raymond Nwabueze, O.P. from this religious community will make this year's appeal through a letter which is enclosed with this week's bulletin since an in-person appeal cannot be made at this time. Your generosity, both spiritually and financially,



Henri writes to a Dutch friend who was one of the many people who helped him through his depression. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Hans,

... After a long period of healing away from my community I have now returned to Daybreak and am glad to be again part of the daily routine here. Most of my struggle was of a spiritual nature. It was a struggle to give all of my heart to God and not to allow myself to be dissipated by the many attractions of the world...It is indeed a great joy to belong to the Lord and really live in intimate communion with Him...You are right when you say that the struggle is not just a personal struggle but is a struggle between the powers of light and the powers of darkness. 


