

From Your Pastor


In today's Gospel Jesus is celebrating mercy and his compassion upon those who initially seem to reject God in their life choices, like the tax collectors and prostitutes, but eventually turn away from sin and choose to live by God's ways.

However, Jesus also points out that virtue, which in this case is the status and learning of the religious leaders of his time, does not make them or anyone like them immune from disobedience and unrighteousness. Understanding God's will, committing to it and doing it, are what bring life. Everyone has a choice as to how to act just like the sons in today's Gospel parable.

In the first reading from the Prophet Ezekiel, the message from the Lord says that "When someone virtuous turns away from virtue to commit iniquity, he dies. But if he turns from the wickedness he has committed, he does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life."

These words from Ezekiel acknowledge not just those who repent and follow God's will by those who "turn from virtue to sin." These words are a good description of the second son in the Gospel parable, and likely the religious leaders and anyone like them, who words signify obedience and piety while their actions speak otherwise.

Plans for Annual Bereavement Mass Changed
