

From Your Pastor

Richard Gaillardetz, a professor of Systematic Theology at Boston College, shares some interesting insights with us into this weekend's readings.

In the First Reading he points out that the Prophet Isaiah describes the biblical image of God's reign as a celebratory banquet. At this banquet a community is shown gathered in grateful response to an entirely unmerited invitation that frees God's people to delight in one another's company. He also mentions that wedding feasts appear frequently in Jesus' teachings.

In this weekend's Gospel, we are reminded to keep in mind two realities. The first is the promise of the coming reign of God which has begun in Jesus. This promise is directed to all of us as an invitation that we have not earned by our behavior or social status. The second reality is that we cannot earn an invitation but must respond to it with generous hearts.

We have to be willing to give ourselves over to the etiquette of banquet feasts. We have to come to the banquet, wearing the appropriate "attire" of hearts open to conversion.

Professor Gaillardetz tells us that full participation is more than just showing up. It means submitting ourselves to a new world run by the logic of gift and celebration, not scarcity and competition. In what we see in today's world, it will do us well to reflect upon this message.

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember those who have preceded us in death. In past years our parish has extended an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past 12 months to gather for a special Mass of remembrance. This year, because of the covid-19 pandemic, the Mass will be open only to a limited number of family members of these deceased parishioners to attend.

Invitations will be mailed to these families, explaining the protocols that we will be following for this Mass. The Mass will be live-streamed on Saturday, November 14th, at 9:00 A.M.

We invite you to view this Mass at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead. Since this Mass is just a little more than four weeks away, please make a note of it.

Registration 2020-2021

All registration information for grades 1-9 and Confirmation can now be found on the parish website. Families will be able to register, and even pay by way of the parish website. We are asking to have all registrations completed by October 2, 2020.

In order to accommodate different comfort levels on returning to in person learning, and to be in compliance with safety standards, things will look a little different this year. Below is an explanation of how classes will work at the different grade levels.

We will to split the year into 2 sessions for grades 1-9.

For Grades 1-5, The 1st session will run from October 19 until the end of January on Mondays or Tuesdays 4:15-5:15pm. The 2nd session will run from the beginning of February until the end of April on Monday or Tuesdays 4:15-5:15pm. Families will choose which session and day their child(ren) would like to attend. There will be 11 in person classes in each of the sessions. During the session that your children are not in person, they will have a monthly Zoom lesson with a family assignment/project to work on throughout the month.

The option to complete the typical 2nd grade year sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion will be available in both sessions. If you attend in person classes in session one, you will receive your sacraments in session one. Those attending in person classes in session two will receive their sacraments in session two.

Grades 6-9 will follow a similar format with 8 ninety minute in person meetings on Sunday evenings in one session and 3 monthly Zoom meetings in the other session. Grades 6-9 sessions will be mid October-the end of January and February-mid May. Students would be in person for one session and in Zoom meetings in the other. Offering in-person classes will be contingent upon availability of volunteer teachers. Other models will be explored if we experience a shortage of available teachers.

Confirmation will conduct the 6 of their classes in the first semester (October - January) online through an invited Zoom link on Sunday mornings. The hope is that we will be able to conduct the remaining 2 classes, Penance Service, Retreat, and Confirmation practice IN PERSON during the Spring Semester (February-May). All Second Semester dates are TBD based on whether or not the Cathedral will host Confirmation this year or if we will hold the Confirmation in local parishes as was needed during the spring of 2020.

Family members will not be invited to enter the sanctuary to light a candle. Invitations will soon be mailed to the families of the 27 parishioners who will be remembered on that day. Their names will be published in a future bulletin so that all of you can lift them and their families in love and support.


