

### From Your Pastor

The Synodal Process in the Catholic Church 1

A synod is a council of a church, composed of clergy and/or laity and usually convened to decide an issue of doctrine, administration or application. Its purpose is to provide an environment of listening and hearing one another on all facets of church life.

Pope Francis is inviting all Catholics, those in the mainstream of church life and on the margins of church life, to voice their dreams, ideas and concerns in preparation for the Synod of Bishops from all over the world to convene in October, 2023. The Pope formally opened this synodal process at the Vatican on October 9-10, 2021. The process is being launched this weekend on October 17<sup>th</sup> in parishes and dioceses around the world.

The October opening is a first step in a larger, longerterm process of incorporating the fruits of Vatican II in terms of becoming a synodal church. The synod is expected to adopt a final document which will guide the continuing development of a synodal church going into the future. The work for this synod in the diocesan and parish consultations is an invitation to creativity. This is an opportunity to be co-creators with the Holy Spirit of God in terms of reinvigorating an engaged community through creativity and a call to be open. It is also an opportunity to reaffirm the good and reimagine some things which could be better. Beginning in October, 2021 dioceses and parishes will be invited to engage in nearly six months of discussions or consultations in which people from across the church will also be invited to participate. It is encouraged that each parish and diocese will let the Holy Spirit guide the discussions. Each diocese is being asked to submit a summary of local discussions by April 1, 2022 to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops which will then take a month to synthesize these discussions into a final written presentation for the Vatican. Once the Vatican receives the synthesized reports of diocesan meeting throughout the world, the Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops will draft by September 2022 the working document that will guide the continental or regional church assembles that will take place by March 2023. These assemblies, in turn, will help in drafting a second working document for the Synod of Bishops when they meet in October 2023. The synod is expected to produce a final document on synodality throughout the church, the hope and dream - as Pope Francis sees it - of Vatican II.

### Fr. Niccolls' message continued:

November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember our beloved dead. As in past years our parish will be extending an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past year to gather for a special Mass of remembrance on Saturday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, at 9:30 A.M. Letters of invitation are being mailed out to those families. The Mass is open for parishioners to attend as well. The Mass will also be live-streamed that Saturday morning. We invite you to either attend this Mass or to view it live-streamed at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead. Since this Mass is just a little more than two weeks away, please make a note of it.

### FROM DEACON PAUL AUDETTE:

Henri writes to a Protestant minister friend about burnout in ministry. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Frank,

...The question of receiving the love of Christ is really very important. I personally feel more and more that sometimes it is harder for us to fully receive love than to give it. I am more and more convinced that we will find the peace and joy of Christ when we let Him truly enter into the deepest places of our heart, especially those places where we are afraid, insecure and self-rejecting. Somehow, true ministry is letting other people drink from the water that overflows from your fountain. Burn-out seems to happen when you let people drink your fountain dry and, so, have nothing left to give...burn-out quite often is the result of not going far enough in our love for Christ and depending too much on our own resources..."



### 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

A bishop wanted to keep in touch with people and get away from the problems and the bureaucracy of running a rather large diocese. So, as often as he could, he would slip away unnoticed, take off his pectoral cross and visit patients in a nursing home and in a hospital. He would introduce himself as Father "John" and bring Communion, hear confessions and anoint the sick. No one really knew who he was. For him, it was a labor of love and, as he put it, 'the time when I renew the grace of my priesthood.'

Grace and greatness come from serving others. Jesus reminds the disciples that they have all experienced how the Romans would force their authority on the people, using force if necessary. Their greatness was self-proclaimed. But in truth, those who are great put themselves at the service of others, willingly sacrificing whatever they have so that life will be better for someone else.

Our goal is to build the community of the church, to practice our faith, supporting and encouraging one another. In the small, seemingly unnoticed moments of love, of hope, of healing and helping, greatness comes. We hear it in words of thanks, we see it in the faces of those who are fed and clothed and taught and loved. We touch it in the hands of the lonely we visit, or the sorrowing we comfort. Find your way to greatness. It will be the source of your greater grace!
