

## From Your Pastor

Our allegiance to our country is important, and so is our allegiance to God. In this weekend's readings, and particularly in the gospel, we are reminded that we belong to God. We must render to God what is God's and repay to him what belong to him. We do this by giving ourselves to God, loving him with all our heart, soul and mind. Giving to God the best of our time talent and treasure is the best offering that we can make to God. In this way we put God first in our lives before everything else. Our participation in the Eucharist, whether in person or remotely during this time of pandemic, unites us with Christ and with one another as an offering to God. This is a grace that strengthens our unity and allegiance to the One to whom we belong both now and forever.

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember those who have preceded us in death. In past years our parish has extended an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past 12 months to gather for a special Mass of remembrance. This year, because of the covid-19 pandemic, the Mass will be open only to a limited number of family members of these deceased parishioners to attend. Invitations will be mailed to these families, explaining the protocols that we will be following for this Mass. The Mass will be live-streamed on Saturday, November 14th, at 9:00 A.M. We invite you to view this Mass at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead. Since this Mass is just a little more than three weeks away, please make a note of it.

When our Spiritual Growth Committee met earlier this month, attendance at Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration was reviewed. As a result of this review, we will have Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration as a "Holy Hour" in the church on the First Fridays of every month, beginning in November, at the conclusion of the 8:00 A.M. Daily Mass, until 10:00 A.M. Because of the coronavirus pandemic, Eucharistic Adoration in a small, confined area (such as the former adoration chapel was) is no longer being allowed. We will continue to review the attendance at this devotion regularly to determine its future and whether we will be able to offer it at other.

#### Registration 2020-2021

All registration information for grades 1-9 and Confirmation can now be found on the parish website. Families will be able to register, and even pay by way of the parish website. We are asking to have all registrations completed by October 2, 2020.

In order to accommodate different comfort levels on returning to in person learning, and to be in compliance with safety standards, things will look a little different this year. Below is an explanation of how classes will work at the different grade levels.

#### We will to split the year into 2 sessions for grades 1-9.

For Grades 1-5, The 1st session will run from October 19 until the end of January on Mondays or Tuesdays 4:15-5:15pm. The 2nd session will run from the beginning of February until the end of April on Monday or Tuesdays 4:15-5:15pm. Families will choose which session and day their child(ren) would like to attend. There will be 11 in person classes in each of the sessions. During the session that your children are not in person, they will have a monthly Zoom lesson with a family assignment/project to work on throughout the month.

The option to complete the typical 2nd grade year sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion will be available in both sessions. If you attend in person classes in session one, you will receive your sacraments in session one. Those attending in person classes in session two will receive their sacraments in session two.

**Grades 6-9** will follow a similar format with 8 ninety minute in person meetings on Sunday evenings in one session and 3 monthly Zoom meetings in the other session. Grades 6-9 sessions will be mid October-the end of January and February-mid May. Students would be in person for one session and in Zoom meetings in the other. Offering in-person classes will be contingent upon availability of volunteer teachers. Other models will be explored if we experience a shortage of available teachers.

Confirmation will conduct the 6 of their classes in the first semester (October - January) online through an invited Zoom link on Sunday mornings. The hope is that we will be able to conduct the remaining 2 classes, Penance Service, Retreat, and Confirmation practice IN PERSON during the Spring Semester (February-May). All Second Semester dates are TBD based on whether or not the Cathedral will host Confirmation this year or if we will hold the Confirmation in local parishes as was needed during the spring of 2020.

## Prayers for the Sick



Henri Nouwen speaks to us through his Letters.

Excerpts from a letter of consolation to the parents of a 23-year-old young woman who died in a horse racing accident in Idaho. (taken from Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life)



...I am very much aware of how hard these days, weeks and months must be for you. She is gone from you and you will miss her painfully. But I hope that you can find comfort and consolation in the awareness that she has meant so much to her friends. The value of life is not in the amount of years but in the intensity and fullness with which it is lived...

Personally I have a strong belief that there is much more to life than we can see and that, although Beth has died, she also has entered into a new life in which her best self continues to exist in the love of God. Sometimes it even seems to me that a special deep and even grateful communication can exist between us and those we loved so much and left us....

I think that anyone who we love sends us his or her spirit when they die...

Even those who are most close to us are only like guests who enter into our homes but leave it again to follow their own often mysterious way. Even children are guests who have to let go when the time has come. This is hard and painful, but don't forget to be grateful for the moments they were with us.
