

From Your Pastor

The Synodal Process in the Catholic Church 2

I believe that if we as church want to incorporate the fruits of Vatican II in terms of becoming a synodal church, then it is important to remember that that Council spoke of collegiality being an important element in how the Church should function. In the Roman Catholic Church, collegiality refers to "the Pope governing the Church in collaboration with the bishops of the local Churches, respecting their proper autonomy." The concept of collegiality, then, is rooted in a spirit of collaboration which is ideally the way that we as church should function. Collaboration is the process of two or more people, entities or organizations working together to complete a task or achieve a goal. Collaboration is similar to cooperation and in most situations requires leadership.

With these concepts in mind, the task of becoming more of a synodal church will mean that we will need to be more focused as a Eucharistic people (clergy and laity). In doing so, I will refer to some of the thoughts about this subject from the late Fr. Henri Nouwen. Fr. Nouwen wrote that our faith in Jesus is truly vital to our becoming more and more of a Eucharistic people. It means that we fully accept the truth that Jesus lives within us and fulfills his divine ministry in and through us. This means that we are the instruments of Jesus who are guided by his Holy Spirit. For us to truly live in this way, we need to acknowledge that the Eucharist is the place where Jesus becomes more present to us. This is where Jesus becomes not only Christ living within us but Christ living among us. As we realize that Christ lives within us, we also come to realize that Christ lives among us, his brothers and sisters, and makes us into a body of people. The teachings of our faith tell us that the Church is the mystical body of Christ here on earth. As this mystical body we as church witness together to the presence of Christ in the world. In other words by our baptism we have become instruments of his Holy Spirit in the world. I believe that this lies at the heart of what collegiality and collaboration mean in becoming that synodal church of which Pope Francis speaks.

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember our beloved dead. As in past years our parish will be extending an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died *Fr. Niccolls' message continued next column:*

during the past year to gather for a special Mass of remembrance on Saturday, November 6th, at 9:30 A.M. Letters of invitation are being mailed out to those families. The Mass is open for parishioners to attend as well. The Mass will also be live-streamed that Saturday morning. Henri writes to a deacon who feels rejected and is questioning his vocation. Henri's personal reflections are something that all of us can relate to, regardless of the "vocation" we have chosen. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear George,

...I'd like to tell you that it is only now, thirty years after my ordination, that I am starting to understand to what I am really called, and starting to claim more fully and directly the mission that God has given me. The past thirty years have not been useless or fruitless but filled with obscurities and ambiguities, and with a lot of spiritual wandering, but I have always been able to hold on to the truth of my ordination. especially during moments when many of the people around me guestioned its value and even, at times. encouraged me to move in different directions. I am intensely grateful for the grace God has given me to remain faithful to my call, even though I haven't always lived faithfully, and the long years of dryness are now revealed to me as the time needed to prepare myself for a more radical commitment to Jesus..."
