

Coming Home to Church 1

As I mentioned in the recent articles regarding the worldwide Synod of Bishops which we will be preparing for over the next two years, the task of becoming more of a synodal church will mean that we will need to be more focused as a Eucharistic people. For us to truly live in this way, we need to acknowledge that the Eucharist is the place where at Mass Jesus becomes more present to us and invites us to be more present to him. We meet him at Mass in four different ways. First, when he gathers us as his Church, for the Lord himself promised us: "Where two or three are gathered in my name. there I am in their midst." Second, he is present in his priest, who acts in his person and has, by his reception of the Sacrament of Ordination, received the power to offer sacramentally the Sacrifice of Christ. Indeed, while it may appear that the priest is celebrating the rite and prayer of the Mass, it is really Christ, our great High Priest, who is offering himself upon the Altar of the Cross for our salvation. Third, he is present in his Word proclaimed. for while our ears hear the voice of lectors, deacons and priests, it is really Christ who is speaking to our hearts when the Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, Christ is present substantially in the consecrated bread and wine, his own Body and Blood, and above all under the species of the Eucharist. "For in this sacrament Christ is present in a unique way, whole and entire, God and man, substantially and permanently. This presence of Christ under this species is called "real", not in an exclusive sense, as if the other kinds of presence were not real, but "par excellence." He becomes not only Christ living within us but Christ living among us, his brothers and sisters, and makes us into a body of people. This is the mystical body of Christ here on earth, the Church. As this mystical body we witness together to the presence of Christ in the world, for it is by our baptism that we have become instruments of his Holy Spirit.

So, in this way we are welcomed by God to Mass. We are welcomed home to the source and summit of the entire Christian life. We are invited to a *Fr. Niccolls' message continued next column:*

The Refugee Story Continues



Deacon Paul's Reflection:






