

From Your Pastor

Coming Home to Church 4

As I conclude these articles of the past several weeks about the worldwide synod that Pope Francis is convening and how we as a Eucharistic people have an important part in it, we saw from last week's article that the Church is a body, not only as a holy and faultless body made Christ-like through Baptism and Eucharist but also as the broken bodies of all the people who are its members. This picture of us as Church points out that we have hearts that are indeed hungry. We hunger for security, relationship. understanding, acknowledgment, and also truth, justice and peace. Our weekly celebrations of the Eucharist will not completely satisfy us, but they do give us nourishment so that we might continue on the journey as true followers of Jesus. At the table of the word, we find wisdom, truth, and challenge in the Scriptures. We also find an identity as the sons and daughters of Abraham and as the disciples of Christ. We belong to an unbroken tradition that spans over 3000 years. At the table of the Eucharist, as we are fed with the very Body and Blood of Christ, our Communion with the Lord also brings us into Communion with our brothers and sisters who share the one bread, the one cup. In this community, we find companionship and support. Celebrating Mass with our parish family also brings us into relationship with all the other communities celebrating Eucharist throughout the world. We are indeed a "catholic" Church and as part of the Church, we share in the Church's mission to address the hungers of the human family worldwide. Together we stand for peace, justice and truth, and through our many Catholic institutions and organizations (Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Charities, etc), we can truly make a difference.

So when we think about our parish family, the people we are with at the banquet of the Lamb each week, do we value it enough in our lives that we want to invite others to join us there, be it family, friends or neighbors? Will they come because it is important to you or me? Or, do we become frustrated or critical if they cannot come on the first invitation, or the second, or even the third. Sometimes we either expect too much of people that we invite to Mass, or they are afraid that too much will be expected of them. Start simple! You may start by saying, "Join me this weekend." — maybe it is for a special event Mass, or a Mass with a meal that follows, or simply because it's your birthday and you want to celebrate it that way. One final thought. Be honest.

Share what you love about your faith and why it is important to you, but let those you are inviting develop their own reasons. Hopefully, the one thing we can all relate to is this: God loves me no matter who I am and wants me to join others at his dinner table. "Blessed are those who are fed at the banquet of the Lamb."

This week we celebrate the beginning of the Season of Advent which is also the beginning of our Church's liturgical year. This year we will be in the C cycle of the liturgical year when we will hear the Gospel of Luke proclaimed through most of the year.

Henri writes to a friend who was struggling with
challenges to her ministry. (taken from "Love, Henri:
Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Ann,

... You have been through some very hard times. and I realize that your heart feels very heavy and that it is very hard for you to be in touch with your own goodness and strength, and your own gifts. I am glad that you did decide to ask for some professional help...l would like to ask you not to focus too much on the ways in which you have been misunderstood, not appreciated or treated unjustly. Although this certainly has happened and has caused you a lot of hurt, I do think that God is calling you to a deeper place where you can step beyond these understandable complaints. Somewhere you have to hear again very clearly the blessing of God that says, 'You are my beloved daughter; on you my favor rests.' When you can hear that voice speaking gently in your heart, it might be possible to let go of some of the hurts that are now causing you so much pain..."



Thank you to our Spiritual Growth Ministry for this wonderful reflection:




