

#### From Your Pastor

This Sunday we begin the Season of Advent which is also the beginning of our Church's year. This year we will be in

the B cycle of the liturgical year when we will hear the Gospel of Mark proclaimed through most of the year. It is commonly held that Mark's Gospel was written within a few decades of Jesus' death and resurrection. It was written in such a way as to invite readers on the same adventure that Mark and Jesus' first disciples encountered. It was an adventure of getting to meet Jesus, to know who he truly is and to commit one's whole life to him. Advent was originally celebrated as a type of "Lent" during the forty days before the feast of Christmas. Gradually Advent developed its own distinctive character, retaining a slight penitential dimension from Lent but emphasizing more of our joy-filled hope at the coming of the Lord.

In this spirit of preparing for the coming of the Lord, we are once again offering a prayer initiative on our parish website where each day parishioners will offer a two or three minute Advent prayer, scripture reading and reflection, focusing upon the true meaning of the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

This Sunday we begin the Season of Advent which Beginning next weekend, December 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>, we will offer three live Masses – one on Saturday at 4:00 P.M. and two on Sunday at 8:00 A.M. & 10:00 A.M.

Also,we will continue to offer the weekend Mass by way of live-stream (or recording) on Sundays at 10:00 A.M. as a service to you.

11/15/2020 The following notice has been revised to comply with the most recent directives issued by our Diocese of Worcester and Bishop McManus:

Because of regulations issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the most recent ones issued by the Diocese of Worcester, we will not be able to have crowded churches. Therefore, registration to sign up for Masses will be required for live attendance at any Christmas Mass since our church can allow for 80 individual seats. Therefore, we will have two Masses on Thursday, December 24<sup>th</sup>, one at 3:00 P.M. and the other at 4:30 P.M. For those who sign up for the 4:30 P.M. Mass, we ask that you arrive no earlier than 4:15 P.M. in order for the church to be completely sanitized. On Christmas Day, December 25<sup>th</sup>, we will have Masses at 8:00 A.M. & 10:00 A.M.

Information will be available on our parish website as Advent begins explaining when and how to register for these Masses. Please follow these directions carefully so that we will be able to accommodate everyone as much as possible. Tickets will be issued for each person who attends these Masses, so you must include an accurate number of people who will be attending Mass in order to have the correct number of tickets. No one will be able to attend these live Masses without a ticket, and everyone who attends these Masses will have a seat (standing will not be allowed.) Tickets will be mailed out to those who register since this is the best way that we can quarantee a seat for those who wish to attend these Masses. We also remind you that since Bishop McManus has suspended the obligation to attend Mass in person, we will also offer Christmas Mass through our parish website beginning at 3:00 P.M. on Thursday, December 24th.

We invite you to take advantage of Christmas Mass on our website if you or anyone among your family or friends test positive for the coronavirus (symptomatic or asymptomatic) in the period leading up to Christmas.

Finally, as we approach the Christmas season, Fr. Donato Infante, our Vocations Director has asked that the following announcement be placed in our parish bulletin:




#### THE FAMILY CONNECTION

Excerpts from a letter to a friend whose marriage is breaking down (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

"...I deeply admire your spiritual strength and your ability to hold on to your Lord in the midst of the storms...There is something incomprehensible about your pain. I am deeply convinced that you and L. had a beautiful marriage, that both of you were very happy with each other, that your life was full of joy and love ... I keep having the deep sense that you are being tested very deeply. You are asked to cling to your Lord no matter what ... You are asked to enter the darkness of not understanding with an ever growing surrender... I also hope and pray that L. and you will be able to find each other again and recommit yourself to each other, but this might not be God's will for you. This is very much a desert time for you, a time of being lost, of having little to hold on to. a time full of temptations to give up, to become bitter and resentful."






