

### From Your Pastor

The following notice has been revised to comply with the most recent directives issued by our Diocese of Worcester and Bishop McManus:

10:00 AM 7th Anniversary Mass for Neal Alan Olen

Requested by his son David Olen

Because of regulations issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the most recent ones issued by the Diocese of Worcester, we will not be able to have crowded churches. Therefore, registration to sign up for Masses will be required for live attendance at any Christmas Mass since our church can allow for 80 individual seats. Therefore, we will have two Masses on Thursday, December 24<sup>th</sup>, one at 3:00 P.M. and the other at 4:30 P.M. For those who sign up for the 4:30 P.M. Mass, we ask that you arrive no earlier than 4:15 P.M. in order for the church to be completely sanitized.

On Christmas Day, December 25<sup>th</sup>, we will have Masses at 8:00 A.M. & 10:00 A.M. Information will be available on our parish website as to when and how to register for these Masses. Please follow these directions carefully so that we will be able to accommodate everyone as much as possible.

#### From Your Pastor continued...

Tickets will be issued for each person who attends these Masses, so you must include an accurate number of people who will be attending Mass in order to have the correct number of tickets. No one will be able to attend these live Masses without a ticket, and everyone who attends these Masses will have a seat (No standing will be allowed.). The tickets will be mailed out to those who register since this is the best way that we can guarantee a seat for those who attend these Masses. We also remind you that since Bishop McManus has suspended the obligation to attend Mass in person, we will also offer Christmas Mass through our parish website beginning at 3:00 P.M. on Thursday, December 24<sup>th</sup>.

We would invite you to take advantage of Christmas Mass on our website if you or anyone among your family or friends have tested positive for the coronavirus (symptomatic or asymptomatic) recently.


#### THE FAMILY CONNECTION

#### The "O" Antiphon



The Advent/Christmas season is rich in symbolism and tradition. In monastic life, during the octave before Christmas Eve, a time that is called the "Golden Nights," the seven "O Antiphons" are sung during Evening Prayer. Each antiphon begins with "O" and addresses Jesus with a unique title that comes from the prophecies of Isaiah and Micah. Centuries ago the Benedictine monks arranged these antiphons with a definite purpose in mind. On December 24 the monk would start with the last title and take the first letter of each one and read the Latin words "Ero Cras," meaning, "Tomorrow I will come." Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for during Advent, and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now assures us he will soon be here. 

<u>Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through</u> his Letters

Excerpts from a letter to a friend who was worried about the survival of humanity. The man's concern in 1981 was the risk of nuclear holocaust.



Henri's response is good advice for those of us who worry about the future of our planet for any number of reasons. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

"...I really don't know if our civilization will survive the century...But important for me is not if our civilization will survive or not but if we can continue to live with hope, and I really think we can because our Lord has given us His promise that He will stay with us at all times. He is the God of the living. He has overcome evil and death and His love is stronger than any form of death and destruction. That is why I feel that we should continually avoid the temptation of despair and deepen our awareness that God is present in the midst of all the chaos that surrounds us and that that presence allows us to live joyfully and peacefully in a world so filled with sorrow and conflict." 
