

From Your Pastor

Advent: Preparing for the Lord's Coming: 2

Advent can be a time to ponder the call to holiness that exists deep inside of us. A holy person is a Spirit -filled person called to manifest the fruits of the Holy Spirit - love, joy and peace as he or she grows and matures. Advent reminds us that Jesus Christ came into this world born into the poverty of his time. Throughout his life and ministry Jesus focused upon and had a special love for the poor. He invites us as holy people to do as he did - to love and minister to the poor. When we recognize that we are poor in spirit, we can minister to the poor. As Church the poor are given to us so that as the Body of Christ here on earth we can be and remain a place of mutual concern where true joy can be found. We will also be a Church of love and peace. To be this type of people in the Church, we have to be able to identify the poor. They are not people who are different from us - living in slums or sleeping on the streets, people in prison, people suffering from mental illness of other afflictions and disabilities or forgotten people living in nursing homes. No, they can be in our own families, churches, workplaces and schools. Even closer, they can be ourselves who can feel unloved, rejected, ignored or abused. It is when we experience this kind of poverty - whether it be far away, close by or in ur own hearts - that we need to be Church, people who hold hands together as brothers and sisters, confess our brokenness and need, forgive one another, heal one another's wounds and recognize the need to gather around the table of Jesus to hear his reassuring word and break bread together. Here is where we can find true holiness and be like Jesus - people of joy, love and peace!

From Deacon Paul Audette Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters

Henri writes to Dan Wakefield, an American novelist, journalist and screenwriter, who had written to Henri about his spiritual struggles following the collapse of a brief marriage. This is Part II of Henri's response. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Dan,

...In your letter, you say that you cannot pray any more. I'd really like to encourage you to continue to pray, but to let your prayer be the prayer of a poor man, prayer which doesn't offer much satisfaction or insight, but is nothing but a simple being present to the One who came as we are, suffered like we do, and offers us his own poverty as a source of consolation and comfort. You really don't have to do anything more than say, 'Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner,' or 'Lord, make haste to help me,' and with the eyes of your heart keep looking at Him who was stripped of all human supports to offer you hope in the midst of despair and light in the midst of darkness..."



Thank you to our Spiritual Growth Ministry for this w reflection:

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!" On this Gaudete (Rejoice in Latin) Sunday, the third week of Advent, we are over halfway through the Advent season, and it is an appropriate time for us to reflect how we, as Christians, are called to be a people of Advent. We live our lives in waiting and anticipation for the coming of the Kingdom, but as this particular weekend reminds us, we are also called to be a people of joy.

Our readings this week remind us to be joyful, rejoice, for our Lord is near. 
