

From Your Pastor

A Christmas Message

How often have we found ourselves saying that this year it is going to be a holiday season like no other. We will probably be socially distanced from many of the people with whom we would spend our holidays or whom we may just see and greet with the prayers and good wishes of the season. Rather than bemoaning the fact that this will be our situation this year, it might do us well to reflect upon what really is essential and important about this time of the year. Fr. Henri Nouwen, a great spiritual writer of the twentieth century, puts it something like this:

"Our faith in God who sent his Son to become Godwith-us and who, with his Son, sent his Spirit to become God-within-us cannot be real without our faith in the Church. The Church is that unlikely body of people through whom God chooses to reveal God's love for us. Just as it seems unlikely to us that God chose to become human in a girl living in a small, not very respected town in the Middle East nearly two thousand years ago, it seems unlikely that God chose to continue his work of salvation in a community of people constantly torn apart by arguments, prejudices, authority conflicts and power games. Still believing in Jesus and believing in the Church are two sides of one faith. It is unlikely but divine."

All too often we look for the Church to be a perfect community of like-minded people. However, God tells us that this is not the way he created the Church to be. It is true that God made the Church to be a community of believers but, as it is mentioned above, we have to deal with people so often in the less than ideal situations of life. In reflecting on Fr. Nouwen's words, let us pray about them and try to see the message of Christmas, as he expressed it in his words today, in the faces and lives of those with whom we come into contact.

This may help us not only get through this pandemic holiday season but renew in us the spirit of Christmas that God has intended us to see and live all along in this coming year of 2021 and in the years to come. May God's blessings of this holiday season and the New Year ahead be with you!



Letter from Bishop Mc Manus

Christmas 2020

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, As Advent gives way to Christmas, we find ourselves in a continued state of waiting, longing and expectation for a promised vaccine. How our world has changed in a year!

Last Christmas, none of us had heard of COVID-19. Since then our lives, jobs, recreation and worship have been shaped by it. COVID precautions have led to COVID-fatigue as we long for a return to normal life.

Anxious waiting and expectation for the vaccine marks and impacts our celebrations. Gatherings in church and at home will be smaller, travel truncated, carols fewer, precautions increased and parties cancelled.

But Christmas is not cancelled. Our way of celebrating has changed, but our reason for celebrating remains the same. While the world awaits the arrival of a vaccine, we celebrate the arrival of the world's Savior.

From Deacon Paul Audette:

Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters

Excerpts from a letter to a scholar studying pastoral care who had written to Henri about his views on handling pain experienced by the terminally ill. This is Part 3 and the conclusion of Henri's response (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

"...All of this I am saying to restate my conviction that often deepening the pain is the way to healing because deepening the pain means to go to that place in me where I am really broken, sinful, dependent and where I'm no longer trying to stay in control but where I can reach out to God and to my fellow human beings without fear ... I agree with you that all of this has a lot of implications for care of terminal patients... I also agree that often much care is primarily concerned with reduction of pain and therefore often avoids the more basic core that often many people look for ... I very much agree with your suggestion that much pastoral care over the last decades has been so deeply affected by contemporary psychological ideas that often the true spiritual dimension of pastoral care has been lost...much work needs to be done to develop a true spiritual-pastoral care for terminally ill people..."




