

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

The theme of humor in the spiritual/religious life has been a frequent topic of Martin's lectures and media appearances. In these excerpts from an April 2, 2007 America Magazine essay (Part X), he treats both the long history of laughter's role in religious practice as well as the reasons why it can be such a healthy element of the spiritual life: "Humor shows Christian fortitude. In the 16th century, when St. Thomas More stepped up to the chopping block, he said to his executioner, 'I pray you, help me on the way up, and I will take care of myself on the way down.' This brand of humor says, 'I do not fear death.'...Humor deepens one's relationship with God. Like any relationship, prayer is leavened by humor. Nonetheless, some Catholics find it difficult to accept the idea that God might want to be playful with them. While traveling to one of her convents, Teresa of Avila was knocked off her donkey and fell into the mud. 'Lord, you couldn't have picked a worse time for this to happen. Why would you let this happen?' And the response in prayer that she heard was. 'That is how I treat my friends.' Teresa said, 'And that is why you have so few of them!' This is a playful way of addressing God that assumes God's own playfulness."

Dear Friends,

January 1, 2023

Pope Francis recently taught that knowing, 'rereading' and sharing our own 'Life Story' is essential. He adds the importance of 'nothing in it the silent and discreet steps of the presence of the Lord." As we begin this New Year I share this letter with you as part of my ongoing reflection, rereading and gratitude as I rejoice in God's presence in my own "Life Story".

Over the 70 years of my lifetime I have spent this Christmas and New Year Season living in Connecticut, Sierra Leone West Africa, Boston, Batiki Island Fiji and here in Worcester. In each city, town or village I was so fortunate to feel the loving presence of God through the care and kindness of those I lived and worked with.

Growing up in a large extended family in Connecticut every Sunday was spent in my grandmother's kitchen full of aunts, uncles, cousins and a whole lot of food and fun. God was certainly there as a we gathered together in that loud, wiggly, growing family.

While living and working as a nurse in a bush hospital in Africa we celebrated each Christmas Eve in a small Catholic church. Trucks full of Muslim and Christian villagers came from miles away to dance and sing to the sound of native drums at Midnight Mass. I felt for sure that God was with us all!

This Christmas New Year Season was the highlight of the year on the Island of Batiki in Fiji. As Peace Corp Volunteers my husband John and I set up a lovely little Christmas tree in our grass hut. So romantic for newlyweds! Village relatives came home to celebrate the holidays with family on the island. Our new 'Fijian family' generously shared their daily food, customs and faith in the loving presence of God with us.

My 'Life Story' reflection will continue next week. Thanks for 'rereading' with me.



On December 28 we celebrated the Feast of the Holy Innocents, the babies slaughtered by King Herod in an effort to make sure that Jesus, the newborn king, wouldn't pose a challenge to his power. The Holy Innocents provide us with a way to approach this new year of 2023 as we strive to be good and faithful Christians. We sometimes think that we know the best way to love and serve God. But inevitably there are obstacles that get in the way – this person and his faults, this challenge, this cross. How am I supposed to become a great saint if God keeps sending me all these trials?

The Holy Innocents were not preoccupied with what they felt was due them, or all the ways they would have preferred to serve God and become saints. They could not say, "Lord, this is not really the kind of saint I expected to be, not quite the form of holiness I had in mind. I had more in mind a sanctity that would be entirely free of opposition and misunderstanding, that would allow me to bask in the sweet feeling of holiness without being radically stripped of everything but you."

We are all long past the innocence enjoyed by the Holy Innocents. But each feast and each saint provide the graces for us to share in their sanctity. So as we venture out into 2023, we can rely on the Holy Innocents to help us, whatever our vocation, to submit bravely, confidently, and peacefully to God's redemptive plan for our life – and to embrace the actual form of the cross he will send for us for our salvation and his glory.
