

Miracles at St. George, "My Mary Stories" - Susan Ovian Booklet can be found in the Mary Chapel

It was here at St. George's Family Prayer Night that I first heard about Medjugorje. At the persistent urging of my sister, I came to say the rosary, something I hadn't done much anymore. As kids we said it more...but who had time now with everything else there was to do?

After the rosary, a couple spoke about the miracles happening now in Medjugorje. They said the Blessed Mother gave messages daily to six children. I was shocked to think this was happening and I knew nothing about it. I had to find out more. I read everything I could find and kept going to Family Prayer Night on Thursdays. I said the rosary once a week.

My sister and I talked about taking the trip and I jokingly said, "if Mary wants me to go she'll have to send me the money." The cost was \$2,200 per couple. The next day started our week at the Cape. Fourth of July week. The day we returned home I went through the mail. I can still feel the chills as I stared at the check for \$2,228! I showed my family and we all knew Mary sent it. I had to put it to the test...I knew it could be a trick. I put all but \$500 in the bank and asked Mary to replace it soon if it was really from her. Two days later the call came from the Bursar's Office at UMass. They wanted my daughter to pick up an overpayment for \$468. She had graduated in May.

Now I knew I had to go, but I was really afraid. The war in Bosnia was peaking and I never was crazy about flying over oceans. I asked Mary for one more sign, "You don't have to give me more money, but please, Blessed Mother, let me know what to do."

Within the next few days I awoke with a thought: "take your son." My husband agreed and from that point on the fear was gone, and we went in October of 1992. Many signs and wonders occurred from rosary beads turning to gold, seeing the sun spin, to actually being in the same room with the visionaries when Mary appeared.

"I've come to tell you that God exists," was one of her first messages. Our Blessed Mother asks us to pray the rosary daily and put her son, Jesus, and the Holy Mass, at the top of our list. (The check was form the State, and is still unexplained.)




