

From Your Pastor

Wednesday, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints and holyday of obligation. Masses for the holyday are at 8:00 A.M., 12:10 P.M. and 6:30 P.M.

I remind you of the invitation to our annual Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, November 4th, at 9:30 A.M. The invitation to this Mass is open to everyone, and it is my hope that many of you will be able to attend.

Many of us may come here today feeling burdened and overwhelmed as to how we could ever fulfill God's command to love our neighbor as completely as today's scriptures demand. Where could we ever get the personal, practical, monetary or other resources to do this? Remember, this is the second command that God gives us. We need to go back and pay attention to the first one – Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. Jesus is telling us to begin here. To love our neighbor properly, we have to begin by seeking God and God's help first. Starting there is beginning at the source of all generous love. We must be filled from the eternal font if we are to pour it out to others. We must practice loving God with all our heart, soul and mind before we can discern how we will best love and serve our neighbor. Our participation at Mass gives us what we need to answer God's call to love others. In the Eucharist we receive Christ: body, blood, soul and divinity. Through Christ's Real Presence here with us in the Eucharist, we are fed with the love God generously gives to us and are equipped to go forth and love as he loves us.

James Martin

(In this excerpt from an essay in the September 26, 1998 "America" magazine, Fr. Martin addresses his own physical infirmities and how these have given him several important spiritual insights)

"I awoke later only dimly aware of the outside world but acutely aware of my own body...At the time, though dopey from the anesthesia (and soon to be drugged with morphine), I felt an IV tube snaking out of my arm and a long drainage tube coming out of the back of my neck. Whichever way I moved, something pulled painfully at my body. I felt like nothing so much as an insect trapped in a spider web. Added to this was the throbbing pain in my jaw and a constricting tangle of bandages swaddling my neck. I felt, in a word, helpless, caught in a web of discomfort and fatigue...An hour later a Jesuit friend came to visit. As I lay there unable to move, he spooned ice and Jell-O into my mouth - all I could eat at the time, but good and cool nonetheless. Later in the week, after five days without bathing, I asked if he could help me shower...Eating and bathing: both simple things I had taken for granted that I could do for myself and by myself. True, it was an experience of humility to feel oneself so totally powerless and dependent on others, but it was also a signal grace to feel myself cared for by friends and, in my case, by brother Jesuits...The experience of unexpected graces like this came rushing in frequently throughout my little ordeal, and frequently enough I again realized the link between suffering and grace...But is this the reason for suffering and pain? Does God make us suffer to show us his grace? Is this the why of suffering? I don't think so. But it certainly is the that of suffering, if we are open to it."







God has already showed how much He loves us. It's our turn to show Him.


In Christianity, November 1st and November 2nd have long been known as days to remember the dead. The dates may have originated in Celtic lands where this time of year marked the beginning of death in nature or from Pope Gregory III, who, on November 1, 735, dedicated an oratory in St. Peter's Basilica to hold the relics of the apostles, martyrs, saints and confessors. The Catholic Church, as well as some other Christian churches, observe All Saints' Day on November 1st and All Souls' Day on November 2nd.

All Saints' Day is a holy day of obligation. It celebrates the holy men and women who have gained the reward of heaven. The Catholic Church recognizes more than 10,0000 saints from a wide variety of background and circumstances. They can inspire us and be great role models for our faith.
