

From Your Pastor

THANK YOU to our pastoral council and to those who assisted them in making our parish's welcome weekend such a great success!

THANK YOU also to those of you who participated in welcome weekend whether it be at parish liturgies, and/or festivities following the Masses. Your participation and service were very much appreciated.

Studies have shown that people who think about their regrets at bedtime as less likely to fall asleep quickly than those who would think about a regular day. There seems to be something about the dark of night that encourages us to think about everything that is wrong with our lives and the world. St. Paul, in today's second reading, takes this idea further. He goes beyond thinking about the negative to focus actively and specifically on what is good. He shows us how to look for evidence of the life of God all around us by seeing it in the just, the pure, the lovely, the gracious, the excellent and the praiseworthy. When we see these, we can have inner peace, knowing that God is with us. He offered to a community that was riddled with anxieties a meditation on things of transcending peace. Jesus offers these same things to us so that we will not become like the wicked tenants in his parable in the Gospel. They, representing the religious leaders of their time, knew their responsibilities but resisted fulfilling them in the way that they should have. We can do better than that!

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember our beloved dead. As in past years our parish will be extending an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past year to gather for a special Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, November 4th, at 9:30 A.M. Letters of invitation are being mailed out to those families. The Mass is open for parishioners to attend as well. The Mass will also be live-streamed that Saturday morning. We invite you to either attend this Mass or to view it live-streamed at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead. Since this Mass is just a little more than three weeks away, please make a note of it.



(In this excerpt from an essay in the September 26, 1998) "America" magazine, Fr. Martin addresses his own physical infirmities and how these have given him several important spiritual insights)

"Almost from the moment I learned about my tumor. I began thinking about Jesus on the cross...And for me the most poignant realization concerned the profound intimacy of bodily suffering...Our bodies, it can be fairly said, are the most intimate parts of our existence, so thinking about surgery, 'invasive' surgery as they say, was daunting. The idea of someone laying open the left side of my face, manipulating my facial nerves and muscles, fishing around for a tumor and sewing it all up again made me wince with fear and nausea... Yet Jesus in his passion welcomed a similar invasion - a piercing of his body - or at least he accepted it as part of God's plan. Normally, we attempt to avoid pain or try to alleviate it. This is good and healthy. Yet it is this very human desire that makes Jesus' actions all the more meaningful and astonishing. The day before my surgery, while attending Mass, as I wondered what it would be like to have my neck sliced open with a scalpel, I thought about Jesus. And I heard anew the words 'This is my body, which will be given up for you."



In this week's Gospel we are told about landowners' attempts to keep their vineyards. The results are bad in both cases. In the first reading the wild grapes could not be eaten or used for wine. In the Gospel the servants and the landowner's son were beaten or killed. In both passages, the landowners represent God and explains to us how God has set in place and continuously cares for everything. God cares for how we live, grow, and interact with Him and His creations.

In the first reading, we are like the vineyard itself. Each of us has free will and can choose to follow God by accepting His love and care for us. We can grow into a healthy vineyard that produces "good grapes" as we share the fruits or our lives with others. If we choose our own paths by denying God's will and love for us this leads us to become the "wild grapes" depicted in the passage. The Gospel, meanwhile, is a parallel to God's sending Jesus as a sacrifice for our sins. We are like the tenants tending the vineyard. We also have free will to choose. We can either accept Jesus, paying our "just due" of love to God the Father who sent Him, or we can choose to refuse this love and cast Jesus away, keeping the gifts we've been given by God.
