### From Your Pastor

In today's gospel we are introduced once again to John the Baptist where we find ourselves at the beginning of the Gospel of John. This gospel presents

John mysteriously as he is one who came "to testify to the light." When he is questioned by the authorities as to his identity, he responds with "I am not." and "No." John finally identifies himself as the one who is preparing the way for someone far greater than he. John the Baptist claims his role joyfully by pointing others to Jesus with humility and clarity. John could have made himself seem more impressive before the religious authorities, but does not make himself the focus of his work. In his humble spirit he uses his voice to prepare the way for Jesus.

### Questions

- 1. John the Baptist claims his joyful role of pointing others to Jesus with humility and clarity. What are the ways that we might use to do our share of using our voice and preparing the way for Jesus?
- 2. When John the Baptist urged people to hope in Jesus, he directed attention away from himself. Can you think of someone who quietly and diligently helps others without drawing attention or recognition?

What do you think is the difference between a humble ministry of preparation like John's and the work done by Jesus?

## Deacon Paul Audette James Martin

(Perhaps the favorite topic of Fr. Martin's writings is the personal quest for holiness in life and the communion of saints who are ever present to help us in that quest, whether through intercession or example.)

"Here is what Mother Teresa said in a letter to her spiritual director. 'In my soul,' she wrote, 'I feel a terrible pain of loss, of God not wanting me, of God not being God, of God not existing.' That's Mother Teresa saying that she struggled with feelings that God did not exist. Eventually, she began to see that this sense of abandonment as a way of God drawing her even closer to the figure of the abandoned Christ and to the abandoned poor...So there you go. Many of us think that the saints might have hard lives – what with all the working with the poor and founding religious orders – but had it easy when it came to faith and prayer. And that kind of thinking sometimes acts as an excuse. We say, 'Well, the saints had this sort of mystical union, so following the Gospel was easier for them. So let's leave the radical Christianity to them.' But as Teresa shows us, this is not always the case. Sometimes the saints had it harder than we do. This makes their examples more inspiring and helps us to feel much closer to them. It helps to know this when we are struggling with our faith that even the saints struggled."



### March for Life Registration now open!


Plan now to attend the 51st annual Mark for Life in Washington, DC on: **January 19, 2024**. Buses will leave from St. Paul's Ca-

Dear Parishioners and Friends.

Pope Francis recently said, "What the poor need is our hearts open to love...we are called to find Christ in them."

It has been my experience that your hearts are amazingly open to love of the poor! You certainly help me to see Christ in them: Christ the homeless child born in Bethlehem, Christ the refugee in flight to Egypt, Christ who fed the hungry, Christ the teacher and friend.

#### You make Christ the Homeless Child visible:

 This past year, your donations helped to give 13 families a place to live and learn at our IHN Shelter. The 23 of them were children who enjoyed summer camp and a music program, learned how to ride and repair a bike, and could rest comfortably and securely within their own family.

### You show us the face of Christ the Refugee:

 It never totally occurred to me that Christ and his young parents were once refugees. Your donations to Parish Outreach has put me in contact with the lives of our now three refugee families from Afghanistan. Just recently a young mom experienced the sad loss of her own mom still living far away in Afghanistan. While there is great joy for them now living here in America, there is also sadness

#### We see Christ who fed the hungry through you:

 This year we served 900 meals at the Mustard Seed and you shared food with hundreds of others who came in need to our three food pantries. The struggles of so many folks are lessened because you shop, carry, cook, prepare and share.

### Thanks to you, Christ the teacher and friend is present among us:

 So many of you volunteer at our Religious Education Classes, and join our voices together to lead us in praise and worship. You lovingly reach out to family, friends and neighbors in need. You pray for and comfort the sick as well as those who grieve. You listen and share your faith quietly and gently. And so much more! Your kindness and love is Christ present among us.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent

Over the last year or more, interest and speculation about the presidential election headlined the news almost every day. As candidates debated the issues and frontrunners emerged, people's excitement grew. They waited for the announcements of running mates, winners, new appointments, and big changes. The anticipation of big ideas and new leaders got everyone's attention and interest.

Out of the depths of oppression and slavery was born the hope and longing for a Savior. The Israelites looked for the day that God's promise of salvation would restore their status as the Chosen People. When John the Baptist arrived, there was much speculation that he might be the One. He created a lot of interest and excitement that prepared the way of the Lord.

We've heard the Advent message so often that it might seem old to us, and Advent may become just another time of year. Perhaps we are not sure what it means to prepare the way of the Lord. But preparing for the Lord is like spring-cleaning. We need to take a good look at ourselves, change the bad habits of the past, and renew ourselves with grace, hope and the promise of life and peace. We announce His coming by our words and deeds. Live the message of the Gospel and you will generate some interest of your own.

The Universal Phase of the 2021 -2024 Synod completed in late October of this year. The Synthesis report from this Universal Phase, *A Synodal Church in Mission* is available at <a href="https://www.synod.va/en/synodal-process/the-universal-phase/documents.html">www.synod.va/en/synodal-process/the-universal-phase/documents.html</a>.

The entire church having "received the fruits of this consultation in order to discern, in prayer and dialogue, the paths that the Spirit is asking us to follow" will continue until October of 2024. At that time the Second session of the Assembly of Bishops will offer it to the Holy Father.

All reports to date from the Synod are available by visiting our parish website <u>saintgeorgesparish.org</u> under the Spiritual Growth Committees' page.

This Universal Phase report moves to encompass the deeper conversations among all those involved including bishops, lay people, those in consecrated life, deacons and priests. The familiar categories (which parishioners here at Saint George spoke of in our gathering sessions) the *Synodal Church: Communion, participation and mission* now emerge as three parts. Part 1 *The Face of the Synodal Church*, Part 2 *All disciples, All Missionaries* and Part 3 *Weaving Bonds, Building Communities*. The introduction, defining, and discussions of these parts leads to building "Matters for Consideration" and "Proposals". These are the action steps along our path. Deeping Our Mission, following the Holy Spirit as we grow in community leading up to the second session in 2024.

There is a lot to read, think, listen and pray about in this next phase. What are your responses to the matters for Consideration? On the Proposals? We as a church need the next year to continue the conversations and complete the enormous work still to be done in realizing the hopes and dreams of our future church.


