

Advent: Preparing for the Lord's Coming 1

We often refer to the Advent and Christmas seasons as times of wonder and contemplation. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, tells us that caring for and cultivating creation is an instruction given by God not only at the beginning of creation and history but one that is given to each one of us. So the wonder of God's creation is something that we should see every day. Advent gives us the opportunity to renew ourselves in this Godgiven instruction. Yet we are easily guided with selfish pride whenever we want to dominate, exploit, manipulate and possess what God has given to us in creation. To truly appreciate creation as a gift from God we must preserve it. This is not only respecting creation but the God who has provided it for us. When we contemplate the wonder of God's creation, whether it be to watch a sunrise or to taste the sweetness of the fruits of the earth, we do what the last Jesuit scholar Fr. Walter Burghardt called a "long, loving look at the real," when referring to what contemplation truly means. Living and enjoying this kind of wonder and contemplation can help us to better appreciate these seasons.

(In this excerpt from an essay in the September 26, 1998 "America" magazine, Fr. Martin addresses his own physical infirmities and how these have given him several important spiritual insights)

"Particularly sobering after my operation was the realization that this - lying in an uncomfortable hospital bed, losing control of my body, feeling helpless and sick – is something that probably awaits me in the future, as it awaits most of us...The tumor turned out to be benign, and so I hope it's not for another 40 or 50 years that I will face my final hospital visit. And, who knows, what takes me to God may not involve a visit to the hospital...Nevertheless, it's the way most of us will end our lives...All of this is very instructive. Our lives are framed by experiences of helplessness and pain – that is. birth and death. And this framing helps to put the years in between into sharper perspective. For if we can realize our radical dependence on God at the beginning and the end, then the life in between becomes more realistic, and ultimately we are made more aware of our constant need for God, in both sickness and health."

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of December 10 our parishes will be conducting the appeal for the **Retirement Fund for Religious**. According to the National Religious Retirement Office, last year, only 31 our of 505 religious communities were adequately funded to care for nearly 24,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests.

Religious communities of women and men were devoted to establishing Catholic schools, hospitals, and charitable agencies. Often this progress came at great sacrifice, and many older sisters, brothers, and religious order priests served for little of no pay. Earlier this year, Pope Francis wrote, "there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel." While this annual collection assists those who have retired from their careers, they never retire from their vows and keep the needs of the people they served for a lifetime in their daily prayers. Currently, 71% of the religious communities have a median age of 70 or older, the highest it has been since this national collection began.

Just as our annual *Celebrate Priesthood* event helps our diocese to care for its retired diocesan priests, this national collection assists many religious communities to provide for aging members. Rising health-care costs and decreased income compound the struggle to provide adequate care.

Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious provides vital funding for medications, nursing care, and more. It also helps religious congregations implement long-range retirement strategies, even as they continue to serve the People of God.

I recognize this is but one of numerous worthy causes in need of assistance; I ask simply that you consider giving to those who have given a lifetime. 



1st Sunday of Advent

"Be Prepared!" is the motto of the Boy Scouts and our Scoutmaster frequently put us to the test. Creating different scenarios, the Scout leaders would ask us how we would respond and what choices we would make. The situations ranged from medical emergencies and first aid to helping someone who was lost or caught in severe weather. To 12- and 13-year-old boys, it was the stuff of adventure!

"Be Prepared" could be a family's motto for Advent. But how do you prepare for Christmas? Begin with an Advent wreath and light it each evening before dinner. Pray a special prayer for each other every day. Plan a time for the whole family to celebrate Reconciliation, or attend Mass during the week, or watch and talk about a spiritual film. Discuss what Christmas means and remember the best of Christmas's past. Read the Scripture readings assigned for each day and keep a journal of your thoughts. Prepare a meal, or donate clothing to a shelter or soup kitchen. Meaningful discussion, spiritual practices and anticipating the celebration of Christmas will prepare everyone to welcome the Savior. Make a plan that takes you on a spiritual adventure!

Worry, you know, is a kind of reverence given to a situation because of its magnitude; how small it must be through God's eyes. You can't get everything done in a day, nor can you get any part of it done as well as it could be, or even as well as you'd like it; so, like the rest of us, you putter at your job with a normal amount of energy, for a reasonable length of time, and go to bed with the humiliating yet exhilarating knowledge that you are only a child of and not God himself."


