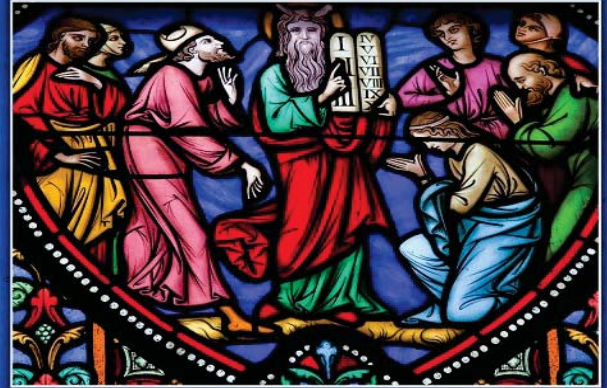

From Your Pastor

In this weekend's gospel Jesus begins by introducing a general principle that guides us. He insists on the Torah's (a Hebrew word meaning law or teaching) enduring value and enters into a dynamic conversation over the deepest meaning and ongoing interpretation of the laws or teachings. For Jesus this deepest meaning connects with our deepest selves. To the consternation of some then and now he does not set aside the law and the prophets, the Jewish scriptures, but presents himself as their interpreter and fulfillment. What follows are three antitheses using the words, "You have heard...but I say..." Some have identified three parts to these antitheses: they reaffirm the law, they radicalize it and then model applications of it. For example, Jesus takes the first one, "You shall not kill..." He reaffirms it and then radicalizes it, by teaching, "Whoever says, you fool...." Such teaching can cause conflict, but this is not the final word. The example of the altar and the court point to the urgency of reconciliation and urge us to be swift and creative in pursuing reconciliation in our own contexts.

Here are some questions to reflect upon with this Gospel:

1. For us to reject those actions that weaken our relationship with God and each other, we have to understand the root of these actions deep within us. How do daily prayer and personal reflection (what we might call an examination of conscience) play a role in your life?
2. Jesus tells us to "go first and reconcile with [our] brother. As you look around, whom do you think Jesus is asking you to consider as a brother or sister?
3. When Jesus speaks of righteousness that "surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees", he is setting a high standard of human conduct because they were considered to be particularly righteous. Do you think that his statement contains the undercurrents of possible religious hypocrisy? Why? How?

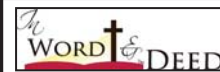

Deacon Paul Audette

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

James Martin attended the Wharton School of Business and worked for 6 years in corporate finance. Here he uses his experiences in corporate life to inform a sketch of the challenges and possibilities for living a spiritual life in the business world. (Part IV): "...one of the pitfalls of trying to live a spiritual life is overlooking the possibility of encountering God in the workplace. There is often a tendency to 'compartmentalize' one's spiritual life, by looking for God only on Sundays or during prayer. Find God in all things, as St. Ignatius Loyola counseled, and that includes work. For some, this means finding a job that offers not only personal satisfaction but also a chance to contribute to the common good. Or it could mean recognizing the opportunity to enjoy deep friendships with co-workers as a way of experiencing God's love. Nevertheless, the ability to appreciate the presence of God at work comes more readily when one is willing to set aside time for prayer and worship."

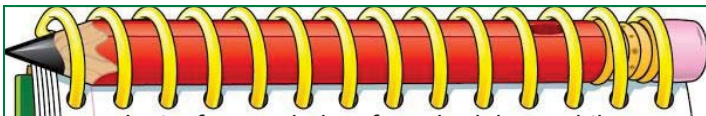

Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner

This weekend, our readings focus on the wisdom of God in His laws and commandments. Although to some, particularly those outside of the Church, these may seem like strict limitations imposed on us, or rigid regulations that we must follow in order to live "correctly." To those of us who observe them, they are, on the contrary, liberating. They free us from sin and remain a constant in a world that frequently changes its expectations.

Particularly in this week's Gospel, we are also challenged not just to follow the letter of the law, but more importantly, the spirit of the law, and to do so with clear conviction. As we are all well aware, the world and its laws can be very complicated, but God's laws are really quite simple at their core: to love God, and to love your neighbor as yourself. When we break down God's laws into these two Great Commandments, we see a clear focus for our lives: an obligation to God, and an obligation to others. And when we're able to see what is expected of us, it does simplify wrapping our heads around how we're called to live, and gives us the chance to more freely and eagerly answer, "Yes," to God's laws.
