

From Your Pastor

Today's Gospel continues from last week's Gospel.
Jesus has now gone to the home of his friend Simon

and performs another miracle, curing Simon's mother-in-law of her fever. After sharing a meal that she has prepared, Jesus spends the night curing many other sick people and driving out demons. The next day he can hardly get in time to pray when Simon arrives to warn him that everyone is looking for him. The word has gotten out that Jesus can do wondrous things. We can empathize with Jesus because in our fast-paced world our schedules can become hectic. It helps to have a person like Simon to guide Jesus around. However, we know that it will be Jesus who will eventually guide Simon, and all of us, on the path to the heavenly kingdom. Despite the bends in the road and other obstacles we may encounter, we know that when we put our lives in Jesus' hands, he will show us the way of God's mercy and compassion. Jesus came to give witness that God does indeed care for each of us.

In ten days we will begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Once again, we remind you that with this Ash Wednesday and all Ash Wednesdays in the years to come, all parishes in the Diocese of Worcester will be taking up a collection for Priest Retirement. This collection will help to supplement revenues that are collected from the endowment of the Legacy of Hope campaign, the annual Partners in Charity appeal, the assessment to parishes for Priest Retirement, the 1% of the Cathedraticum (Diocesan Tax to parishes) that is used for Priest Retirement and the annual Celebrate Priesthood Program held in October. Without this collection our Diocese of Worcester will continue to operate in a deficit to fund Priest Retirement. Please be as generous as you can in supporting this collection. Your generosity will be greatly appreciated.

(Perhaps the favorite topic of Fr. Martin's writings is the personal quest for holiness in life and the communion of saints who are ever present to help us in that quest, whether through intercession or example.)

"Here are three basic ways to incorporate the saints into your work in parishes and high schools and colleges and hospitals and chanceries and retreat centers. 1. Teach. The biggest obstacle to devotion to the saints is a lack of understanding of how amazing their lives were, and how interesting they are. Some Catholics still see them frozen in stained glass, or as perfect, unattainable models far removed from any relevance. Or too boring... So...teach the real stories of the saints, and suggest resources and books to help people meet the real person...sometimes movies are just as good...2. Worship. The most natural way, the way already provided by the church's tradition, is to tell their stories on their feast days, even if briefly...3. *Innovate*. Be creative...Over the course of my life, and quite by surprise, then, I have gone from someone suspicious of devotion to the saints to someone who counts it as one of the great joys of my life. And these days I wonder which companions I will meet next."







Miracles at St. George, "My Mary Stories" - Bob Ovian, Jr., Part 5 Page 9 - 12: "Miracles in Medjugorje", Booklet can be found in the Mary Chapel

It's hard to see where earth ends and heaven begins in Medjugorje, the village between the hills. Its people are warriors, but not in the pugilistic sense. They fight an unseen enemy as many people around the world do. One without rules, morals, or hope. This enemy's mission is to destroy the world of man.

The people of Medjugorje focus their lives around the Holy Mass and following the will of God. They arm themselves with weapons that can pierce the strongest armor, the rosary, fasting and prayer from the heart and love for The Father. I was fortunate enough to visit Medjugorje in October of 1992.

The first miraculous event I witnessed involved a young woman in our group. We took a bus to the other side of the village to see Visca, one of the six visionaries. Stepping out of the bus she realized her rosary beads were missing. They were very special to her and had sentimental value. We all looked for them but could not find them. She was very upset. After meeting and being prayed over by Visca, we boarded the bus for our return trip. To everyone's surprise, the missing rosary beads were right on her seat and amazingly, they had turned to gold!

The Bosnian war was in progress and Dragon, our interpreter, told us the fighting was only three miles away. He said a grenade had been thrown at a house two doors down from where we stayed. He said "luckily it killed only a cow, a pig, and a chicken". Medjugorje had been miraculously protected during the conflict. Enemy pilots reported trying to drop bombs but not being able to because of a mysterious cloud cover or unforeseen mechanical problems.

One night my cousin Dave and I were sitting outside watching the sky. I asked someone why there was so much heat lightening here. That's when I was told it was shells exploding from the bombs. The next morning Dave and I heard people outside our bedroom door. We went to see what was happening. We heard people saying, "The Cross! The Cross!". We grabbed our video camera and went to the balcony to get a look. The 15 ton cross at the top of the mountain had actually lifted off its base and was suspended in air and was slowly spinning! We have it on tape.

In the courtyard of St. James church we witnessed the miracle of the sun. At that time Our Blessed Mother was appearing to the visionaries in the choir loft. The sun was pulsating like a heart and there were pinwheels of color circling the sun. We could stare directly at it without seeing spots or hurting our eyes. We filmed it.

One of the most impressive miracles was the gathering of hundreds of birds about 30 minutes before Mary's apparition...TO FIND OUT WHAT HAPPENED NEXT, see the booklet in the Mary Chapel.




ture of purses and baby booties that were crocheted by one of the older girls using yarn donated by a parishioner from St. George. Thank you for all that you do for these families!

What is the Mustard Seed Catholic Worker?

The Mustard Seed of Worcester began in 1972 when two Holy Cross College students wanted to make a difference in the lives of the poor. Since then it has continued its main mission of providing a safe place to eat, with kindness and respect, for all who come to the door. The work is inspired by the example of Dorothy Day who began the first "Catholic Worker House of Hospitality" decades ago. The Mustard Seed is not funded by any one religion or group. There is no paid staff.

Since 2014 St. George parish has joined the Mustard Seed Community to serve meals and to provide basic necessities to our neighbors in need. Together as a community of faith we strive to practice the "Works of Mercy", to care for creation and our neighborhood.

Currently, with the help of our community, the Mustard Seed offers a free Medical Clinic, a weekly Food Pantry, basic clothing and hygiene supplies as well as a Christmas Giving Tree gift for guests and families with young children.



Who Was St. George?

Following is a biography of St. George that appeared in the January issue of Magnificat magazine. We offer it both because St. George is our parish patron but also because this particular biography is refreshingly different from the usual biographies we read of St. George:

Saint George is generally considered to have been a soldiermartyr under Diocletian. He was canonized in 494, but gained enormous popularity during the Middle Ages as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, who were specially invoked during the Plague. The most popular legend of Saint George, found in the "Golden Legend" of Blessed Jacobus de Voragine, tells how George saved a young woman and her whole town by killing a dragon...Catalonia, the northeast corner of the Spanish peninsula, declared Saint George its patron in 1456. His feast on April 23 became a major holiday, associated with marriages and betrothals. According to the Catalan version of the legend, roses sprang up where the dragon's blood spilled. Hence it is the custom for men to give ladies roses on this day. (Ladies, on the other hand, give men books, because the holiday falls on or near the death anniversaries of Shakespeare and Cervantes.)...George is also a beloved patron of England, in whose battles he has a long tradition of miraculous intervention. As recently as 1914, British soldiers, about to be overpowered by a larger German force, reported a winged army around them, calling upon their leader: either Saint George or Saint Michael, depending on the account. The German infantry paused their onslaught, and the British forces escaped destruction. Later, German prisoners mentioned their surprise at seeing the British using longbows
