

From Your Pastor

In today's Gospel Jesus says, "I am the resurrection and the life: whoever believes in me, even if

he dies, will live and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." In Baptism, we have died with Jesus in the blessed hope that we will rise with him on the last day. We can call to mind Jesus' words, "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains a single grain; but if it dies it bears much fruit." According to the Didache, the ancient teaching of the Twelve Apostles, the grains of wheat which were used to make the bread which becomes the Body of Christ, were once scattered on the hillside. When the grains were gathered and baked, they became a single loaf. It is in this same way that each of us who receives the Holy Eucharist becomes one in the Body of Christ. This oneness is what we are called to by Jesus who wants us to enjoy the light and life itself. He also calls to roll away the stones of poverty, indifference, violence and personal and social sin that keep others in their tombs. After all, the Bread of Life, which is the Eucharist because it is Jesus himself, is food for our journey right now, turning death into life and Lent into Easter.

LENTEN QUIET EVENING: On Tuesday evening, March 28th, from 6:30-8:00 P.M. we will have a Lenten evening of prayer & reflection in church. This will be an opportunity to go to confession and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We encourage you to take this opportunity to do so.

Return to the Distribution of Communion Under Both Species:

Beginning Easter Sunday, Bishop McManus will lift the last of the COVID-19 restrictions from three years ago and will allow the distribution of the Precious Blood along with the distribution of the Body of Christ during Mass. The bishop has given this permission to pastors whenever they deem it appropriate for Communion under both species to occur in their parishes. In light of the fact that the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion greatly diminished during this three-year period, the return to the distribution of the Precious Blood will begin in a limited manner here at St. George's (with two cups at the center communion station of the church) beginning on the weekend of May 6th/7th. This period of time (March-April) will allow us to have a sufficient number of ministers well trained for its distribution.

This pattern of spirituality defines our life of faith. We struggle with temptation and are changed by the grace we receive. Our experience of God renews us and we seek greater clarity in our understanding and love of Him.

These lessons all prepare us for the greatest and final lesson. Filled with God's Spirit, the very life and breath of God, we are given new and eternal life. Like the people of Ezekiel's time, or Lazarus, we are called to life in God, never to be separated from Him. It is this promise of the Lord that gives us hope and strength to seek Him, to find Him and to love Him forever. ~James Gaffney-Pilot Bulletins



Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all *Fridays of Lent.
- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations.

What is the Mustard Seed Catholic Worker?

The Mustard Seed of Worcester began in 1972 when two Holy Cross College students wanted to make a difference in the lives of the poor. Since then it has continued its main mission of providing a safe place to eat, with kindness and respect, for all who come to the door. The work is inspired by the example of Dorothy Day who began the first "Catholic Worker House of Hospitality" decades ago. The Mustard Seed is not funded by any one religion or group. There is no paid staff.

Since 2014 St. George parish has joined the Mustard Seed Community to serve meals and to provide basic necessities to our neighbors in need. Together as a community of faith we strive to practice the "Works of Mercy", to care for creation and our neighborhood.

Currently, with the help of our community, the Mustard Seed offers a free Medical Clinic, a weekly Food Pantry, basic clothing and hygiene supplies as well as a Christmas Giving Tree gift for guests and families with young children.

Hope For Housing Cards Help Prevent Family Homelessness

Hope for Housing is a non-profit program developed by our parishioner Matt Ryan with the Interfaith Coalition to Prevent Family Homelessness and the Central Massachusetts Housing Alliance. Sadly, Matt is now deceased, but his work goes on, raising awareness about homelessness in our community and utilizing the collective buying power of 30 congregations to raise money for the prevention of family homelessness. The fastest growing homeless population is children who experience deflated self worth, diminished school achievement and related health and emotional issues.

These Gift Cards for local retailers, including Big Y, CVS, Dunkin' Donuts, Hannaford, Panera, Shaws, Stop & Shop, Target, Starbucks, and TJ Max are purchased in bulk, which in turn are sold to members of participating congregations who receive the full value of the card. The retailers donate 2-10% of all sales to the Hope for Housing program to assist families at risk of homelessness. By purchasing gift cards for **your use** at local retailers, you can help to stabilize families by providing counseling and support to keep them in their homes.

This week we heard the Gospel telling of the final miracle Jesus performed before his death-the raising of Lazarus from the dead. We heard that Jesus arrived at the home of Martha and Marv in Bethany four days after learning of the illness of Lazarus. Both Martha and Mary said as they greeted Jesus, "If you had been here my brother would not have died." But still clinging to faith Martha says, "But even now I know whatever you ask of God, God will give you." We may recall difficult circumstances during which God seems to be absent in our lives and yet we hold fast to our faith. Then at a later time God's response becomes evident. In the Bible story Jesus responds to Martha and Mary with tears and action. He calls out loudly, "Lazarus come out!" And Lazarus did, much to the amazement of those present. Many who had come to support Martha and Mary became followers of Jesus that day.


Now we move forward to today's world and the pilgrimage Rev. James Martin S.J. took to the Holy Land and the reflections he shared concerning this particular Gospel in his book, 'Jesus-A Pilgrimage'. Fr. Martin describes Bethany as it is today. There is a wall separating the Palestinian people from the Israeli people making access to Bethany more difficult. Bethany itself is very poor resembling a slum city. Fr. Martin had meditated in the past several times on this miracle and visiting the actual site was very important to him. He secured the key to a metal door leading to the tomb of Lazarus from a shopkeeper across the street. He was told to turn on the light before proceeding down the flight of uneven stairs. Father tentatively descended wondering what he would find. In the room at the foot of the stairs was a small low opening through which he crawled. He was alone in a small chamber: the actual tomb. As he prayed, Fr. Martin thought about what it was like for Lazarus to hear the voice of Jesus calling him to come out. What would it mean to live again? It would mean "change" which can be frightening.

Actually being present in the tomb of Lazarus brought about deep spiritual awareness to Fr. Martin and placed him on the path of some changes in his life. The image of Jesus saying the words, "Unbind him and let him go" came to his mind. Fr. Martin was ready to set aside his focus on the past, leave the bandages of the false self behind and step into the light.
