

From Your Pastor

First of all, I want to thank all of you who took part in our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies, especially our staff, altar servers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, and music ministry. The assistance on the part of all helped to make these liturgies very spiritually and prayerfully uplifting ceremonies. My thanks to all!

I also want to take this opportunity to thank you for your cards, gifts and treats during this Easter season. Your overwhelming generosity at this time of the year is gratefully appreciated. Thank you!!!

I remind you that today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Please join us for a Holy Hour today from 11:30 A.M. - 12:30 P.M. in church. During this hour we will have Adoration and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament along with the recitation of the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet and a time for quiet prayer. The Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction.

Today's scriptures recall the gathering of the early disciples with the Apostles for what was known as the "Breaking of the Bread" which is one of the most popular names used by the New Testament to describe the Mass. This gathering in the life of the early Church was one of its main elements. They broke bread together, which meant that they ate together and shared life over meals in their homes. It also meant that they celebrated the Lord's Supper together as part of those meals. Many of them witnessed to the presence of Jesus without actually seeing him. They are the ones who Jesus tells Thomas and the rest of his Apostles and disciples gathered in that lock room have believed although they have not seen. For us, we have come to see Jesus in the Holy Eucharist where we gather today to celebrate his presence among us in the breaking of the Bread, his Body, and sharing of the cup of his Blood every time we gather for Mass. With wonder and worship, we, too, are like Thomas who respond, "My Lord and My God!"

Return to the Distribution of Communion Under Both Species:

Beginning Easter Sunday, Bishop McManus will lift the last of the COVID-19 restrictions from three years ago and will allow the distribution of the Precious Blood along with the distribution of the Body of Christ during Mass. The bishop has given this permission to pastors whenever they deem it appropriate for Communion under both species to occur in their parishes. In light of the fact that the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion greatly diminished during this three-year period, the return to the distribution of the Precious Blood will begin in a limited manner here at St. George's (with two cups at the center communion station of the church) beginning on the weekend of May 6th/7th. This period of time (March-April) will allow us to have a sufficient number of ministers well trained for its distribution.





James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

In this essay from the June 6, 2012 issue of America magazine, James Martin SJ expresses his frustrations with the church, including sharp divisions between Catholics and denunciations of leading progressive Catholics as heretics. However, it also indicates where Martin believes healing is possible and movement beyond impasse most likely: in a focus on Christ, on the saints, on the long arc of history. (Part I): "Dear God, sometimes I get so frustrated with your church... I know that I'm not alone...Priests and deacons, and brothers and sisters, can feel frustrated, too, And I'll bet that even bishops and popes feel frustrated. We grow worried and concerned and bothered and angry and sometimes scandalized because your divine institution, our home, is filled with human beings who are sinful. Just like me... But I get frustrated most of all when I feel that there are things that need to be changed and I don't have the power to change them... So I need your help, God... Help me to remember that Jesus promised that he would be with us until the end of time, and that your church is always guided by the Holy Spirit, even it it's hard for me to see. Sometimes change happens suddenly, and the Spirit astonishes us, but often in the church it happens slowly. In your time, not mine. Help me to know the seeds that I plant with love in the ground of your church will one day bloom. So give me patience."

There is no paid staff.

Since 2014 St. George parish has joined the Mustard Seed Community to serve meals and to provide basic necessities to our neighbors in need. Together as a community of faith we strive to practice the "Works of Mercy", to care for creation and our neighborhood.

Currently, with the help of our community, the Mustard Seed offers a free Medical Clinic, a weekly Food Pantry, basic clothing and hygiene supplies as well as a Christmas Giving Tree gift for guests and families with young children.

Perhaps that is why Easter is the longest season of the Catholic Faith, beginning with the Resurrection on Easter Sunday, April 9th and ending on Pentecost Sunday, May 28th.

This newness and life celebrated in the Church's Easter season is abound for fifty days. God has created a rich season of rebirth reflected in nature. The greening of grass, the bold colors of early flowers, the budding of trees. All rising from the ground and encouraged by healing water.

A seven-week season lends plenty of time to celebrate and strengthen our newly transformed selves. Celebrating may help to avoid falling back into old or pre-Lenten ways. Continue to deepen a relationship with Christ using the connections made in Lent. The daily reading and reflecting on the Gospel and prayer help to keep you growing. Share with others the events, successes and shortcomings of your Lenten and Paschal journey. What has worked for you could help to strengthen others.

Signify your personal new beginning in Christ with outward signs. Carry the Cross with you through the Easter Season. Literally wear a cross in remembrance of Christ's suffering and sacrifice for us. Bless yourself and others by making the sign of the Cross, in both your coming and you're going. This is an opportunity to use the Holy water distributed at Easter. Commit to attending Sunday Mass regularly during the Easter Season. The Acts of the Apostles will be read and these acts develop understanding of the early days of the church and propagation of the faith. On the fiftieth day – the celebration of the Easter Season will draw to a close. Catholics will welcome the gifts the Holy spirit and extinguish the Paschal candle. The kingdom of God will continue to grow as we look to welcome our youth receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Eucharist.
