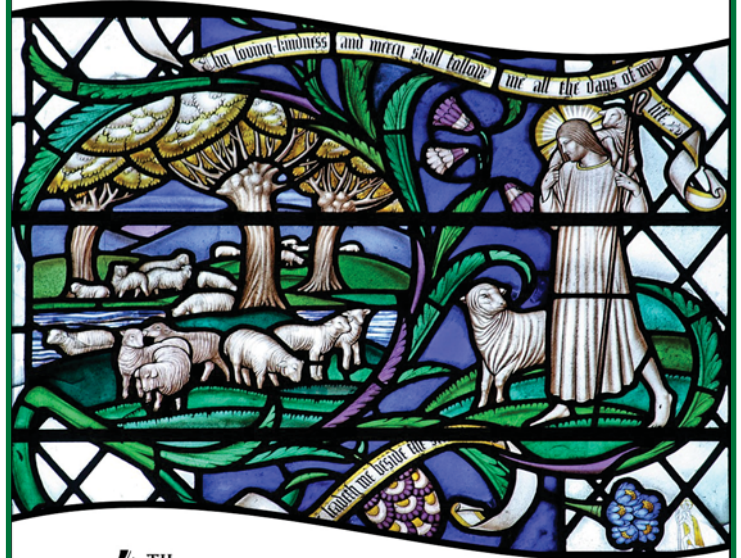

From Your Pastor

Seminarian Summer Assignment: I am pleased to announce that Daniel Morrissey who is finishing his first year of Pre-Theology at John's Seminary in Brighton will be assigned here for this summer. Dan is a native of North Oxford and will begin his assignment here later this month. I look forward to Dan's arrival here for his summer assignment, and I am sure that you will welcome him with the same hospitality that you have shown to our other seminarians in the past.

Upcoming Ordinations: On Saturday, May 20th, at 10:00 A.M. Luke Johnson (our seminarian from the summer of 2021) will be ordained to the Diaconate at St. Paul's Cathedral. On Saturday, June 3rd, at 10:00 A.M. Deacon Peter Bui (our seminarian from the summer of 2019) will be one of two young men who will be ordained to the Priesthood at St. Paul's Cathedral. Please make a note of these dates and if your schedules allow, plan on attending these ordinations.

Today's reading from John's Gospel deals with metaphor of Jesus as the Good Shepherd who feeds his sheep and lays down his life for them in their redemption by his Precious Blood. He is pleased to settle them in eternal pastures where he sets a table before them in the sight of their foes (as referred to in today's Psalm 23). This is the banquet to which Jesus calls us and sets before us each week at Mass. One day we will hopefully experience Jesus' call to us to join him in the eternal banquet of heaven.

Return to the Distribution of Communion Under Both Species:

Bishop McManus has lifted the last of the COVID-19 restrictions from three years ago and will allow the distribution of the Precious Blood along with the distribution of the Body of Christ during Mass once again. The bishop has given this permission to pastors whenever they deem it appropriate for Communion under both species to occur in their parishes. In light of the fact that the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion greatly diminished during this three-year period, the return to the distribution of the Precious Blood will begin in a limited manner here at St. George's (with two cups at the center communion station of the church) beginning on the weekend of May 6th/7th. This period of time (March-April) will allow us to have a sufficient number of ministers well trained for its distribution.

PLEASE NOTE: The practice of dipping the consecrated host into the cup containing the Precious Blood, called intinction, is not allowed. To receive the Precious Blood, the only practice that is allowed is to take the cup from the minister after responding "Amen.", consume a little of the Precious Blood, and give the cup back to the minister. Thank you for your cooperation.

Deacon Paul Audette

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

In this essay from the June 6, 2012 issue of America magazine, James Martin SJ expresses his frustrations with the church, including sharp divisions between Catholics and denunciations of leading progressive Catholics as heretics. However, it also indicates where Martin believes healing is possible and movement beyond impasse most likely: in a focus on Christ, on the saints, on the long arc of history. (Part III): "Dear God, help me to believe that your Spirit can do anything: raise up saints when we need them most, soften hearts when they seem hardened, open minds when they seem closed, inspire confidence when all seems lost, help us do what seemed impossible until it was done. This is the same Spirit than converted Paul, inspired Augustine, called Francis of Assisi, emboldened Catherine of Siena, consoled Ignatius of Loyola, comforted Therese of Lisieux, enlivened John XXIII, accompanied Teresa of Calcutta, strengthened Dorothy Day and encouraged John Paul II. It is the same Spirit that is with us today, and your Spirit has lost none of its power. Give me faith."

While it seems hard to believe, we are almost halfway through this beautiful Easter season! The grass is turning green, the flowers are starting to bloom. We are celebrating spring and everything the season brings forth. Congratulations to our Communion students who will be receiving Holy Eucharist for the very first time today and to all our young men and women who will be confirmed next week at St. Paul Cathedral.

During this season, we also remember the patron saint of our parish. The feast day of St. George was one week ago today on April 23rd. Our church website has a very nice writeup on St. George which we would encourage you to read. It can be found in the section called "Our Parish Story". Here is a very brief overview about St. George.

St. George is often depicted as a knight slaying a fierce and terrible dragon. It is more likely that he was an officer in the Roman Army in the 3rd century A.D. and may have slayed a giant crocodile that was threatening the townspeople along the banks of the river. A dragon was considered as a symbol of the devil or sin so this was an example of good conquering evil. St. George had a reputation for virtue and holiness. He displayed courage, perseverance, and compassion in battle and in dealing with those less fortunate. His fearless faith in Christ eventually led to martyrdom for refusing to make sacrifices to pagan gods. St. George was canonized a saint 494 A.D. by Pope Gelasius.

Here is one simple prayer in honor of St. George:

Lord, help us to rejoice in the glorious victory of St. George and give us courage to follow the example of our patron saint. Amen.
