

From Your Pastor

One thing in the life of Jesus that is most noteworthy is his recourse to prayer. Today's Gospel is

the conclusion of Jesus' farewell discourse and prayer to the Father. In this Gospel Jesus lifts his eyes to heaven and prays in the midst of uncertainty and fear that surrounded his Last Supper. Jesus not only prays for himself but for his disciples. Jesus' disciples may already be getting a taste of eternal life since they have come to know the only true God and the one whom he has sent - Jesus Christ. However, Jesus knows their weaknesses and how his forthcoming death will challenge them. In this prayer we learn of Jesus' intimacy with the Father, and his prayer for the protection, encouragement and strength they will need if they are to go out into the world as active missionaries. Joining our prayer to that of Jesus is how we acknowledge Jesus as the Son of God who is there within us. Sometimes our formal prayers or the liturgical or communal prayers help us to articulate that love and need. At other times we may rely on what pours forth from our hearts even if it seems disjointed and inarticulate. Whenever we bring our praises and needs to God, it is an act of love. We also learn that our destiny of eternal life does not depend upon ourselves but on God. Jesus teaches all of his disciples, then and now, that eternal life is not only something they will enter when they die, but is the fullness of life that they will experience even in this life, through their union with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Here are some questions to reflect upon with this Gospel:

- 1. Think of one person for whom you have promised to pray. How might you bring that prayer into the present moment with that person? Now think of someone whom you have asked to pray for you. Could you bring that prayer into the present moment as well?
- 2. Have you or someone you know ever suffered for the name of Christ?
- 3. Have you ever tasted or experienced eternal life now? In what way have you had this experience?





James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

James Martin SJ in his writings points the reader toward the hidden or obscured treasures of daily life, even when that life can seem one of pointless suffering or underserved struggle. In this essay from the February 13, 2012 issue of America magazine, Fr. Martin describes Six Stupid Things I Never Want To Do Again (Part II): "3. Get people to like you. I spent all of my teens, most of my 20s, a great deal of my 30s and too much of my 40s trying to get people to like me. But forcing people's affections never works. Besides, it takes too much energy to tailor yourself to what you think people will like. Your true friends like you already. Be open to change and growth by all means, but treasure friends who love you for who you are...4. Be a ierk. You're tired. You're rushed. You've got a cold. You're late. You're angry about something your boss said. Yes, you are miserable. That doesn't mean you have to be a jerk to everyone else. It really doesn't. Sure, share your frustrations and struggles with close friends, but don't make everyone else's life more miserable by passing on your misery. Once I joked to a friend, 'Boy, my life is such a cross!' 'Yes,' he said, 'But for you or others?'"



Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner

In the Fall of 2021. Pope Francis opened the Synod on Synodality. He invited the entire Church to "journey together" in this time of "renewal" to reflect on the processes of the church. To determine the processes that can, "help her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission."

In the spring of 2022 our own parish held gatherings to discuss our experiences and thoughts on the future of our church. We discussed and shared many experiences and hopes for our local parish, the Diocese and our shared Catholic faith.

As the Synod moves through this second year, many voices have been heard through Synod discussions throughout the world. Remarkably some of what the voices have shared are an echo of the voices that have spoken from our own parish. The voices that spoke of marginalization of people. Marginalization of women, those with alternate lifestyles, and the voices of those that have suffered at the hands of the church. The voices of divorced and remarried Catholics-uncertain of their place to receive the Holy Eucharist.

Recently Pope Francis made some changes in the discussions and gatherings going forward, as the Synod moves into the final phase. This is important news for those of you who attended gatherings here and were concerned that "our voices might not be heard", "might not make a difference".

Some of the changes being made in preparation for the final gatherings and writings on the 2023-2024 Synod are about those who will have a vote.

An additional list of 140 people will be selected by the leadership of this years Continental Synod meetings. Seventy of these members who are priests, consecrated women, deacons and laypeople will be chosen by Pope Francis himself and will become eligible to vote.

Of the seventy people selected fifty percent will be women. Pope Frances also wants the selections to emphasize and include "young people".

In the past, ten male priests were selected to represent those in consecrated life. Pope Francis makes a second change here requiring that five men and five women be elected to represent those in consecrated life.

The final modification Pope Francis shared - he will personally choose the representatives of the Vatican dicastery's who will participate in the assembly.

These of course are not monumental changes. However, they are notable changes made from within a progressing Synod. Perhaps already signaling change in our journey for-


