From Your Pastor

Return to the Distribution of Communion Under Both Species:

Bishop McManus has lifted the last of the COVID-19 restrictions from three years ago and will allow the distribution of the Precious Blood along with the distribution of the Body of Christ during Mass once again. The bishop has given this permission to pastors whenever they deem it appropriate for Communion under both species to occur in their parishes. In light of the fact that the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion greatly diminished during this three-year period, the return to the distribution of the Precious Blood will begin in a limited manner here at St. George's (with two cups at the center communion station of the church) beginning this weekend, May 6th/7th.

PLEASE NOTE: The practice of dipping the consecrated host into the cup containing the Precious Blood, called intinction, is not allowed. To receive the Precious Blood, the only practice that is allowed is to take the cup from the minister after responding "Amen.", consume a little of the Precious Blood, and give the cup back to the minister. Thank you for your cooperation.

Seminarian Summer Assignment: I am pleased to announce that Daniel Morrissey who is finishing his first year of Pre-Theology at John's Seminary in Brighton will be assigned here for this summer. Dan is a native of North Oxford and will begin his assignment here later this month. I look forward to Dan's arrival here for his summer assignment, and I am sure that you will welcome him with the same hospitality that you have shown to our other seminarians in the past.

Upcoming Ordinations: On Saturday, May 20th, at 10:00 A.M. Luke Johnson (our seminarian from the summer of 2021) will be ordained to the Diaconate at St. Paul's Cathedral. On Saturday, June 3rd, at 10:00 A.M. Deacon Peter Bui (our seminarian from the summer of 2019) will be one of two young men who will be ordained to the Priesthood at St. Paul's Cathedral. Please make a note of these dates and if your schedules allow, plan on attending these ordinations.

Deacon Paul Audette

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

In this essay from the June 6, 2012 issue of *America* magazine, James Martin SJ expresses his frustrations with the church, including sharp divisions between Catholics and denunciations of leading progressive Catholics as heretics. However, it also indicates where Martin believes healing is possible and movement beyond impasse most likely: in a focus on Christ, on the saints, on the long arc of history. (Part IV and Conclusion): "Dear God, help me to remember all your saints. Most of them had it a lot worse than I do. They were frustrated with your church at times, struggled with it, and were occasionally persecuted by it. Joan of Arc was burned at the stake by church authorities. Ignatius of Loyola was thrown into jail by the Inquisition. Mary MacKillop was excommunicated. If they can trust in your church in the midst of those difficulties, so can I. Give me courage...Help me to be peaceful when people tell me that I don't belong in the church, that I'm a heretic for trying to make things better, or that I'm not a good Catholic. I know that I was baptized. You called me by name to be in your church, God. As long as I draw breath, help me remember how the holy waters of baptism welcomed me into your holy family of sinners and saints. Let the voice that called me into your church be what I hear when other voices tell me that I'm not welcome in the church. Give me peace...Most of all, help me to place all of my hope in your Son. My faith is in Jesus Christ. Give me only his love and his grace. That's enough for me...Help me God and help your church...Amen."

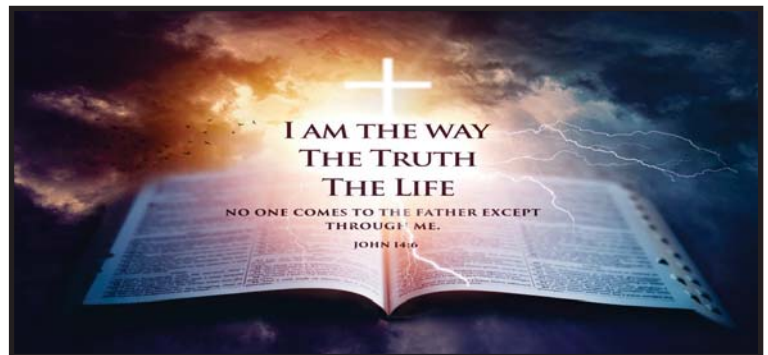

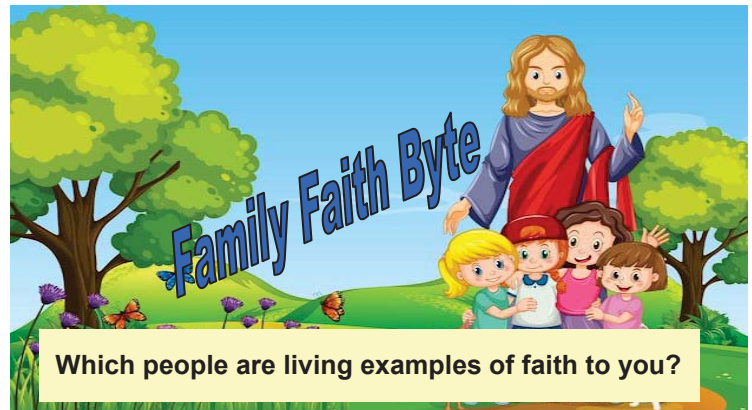

Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner

Father Simeon, O.C.S.O. (formerly Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis) is a Trappist monk at St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer. He recently published Volume IV of *Fire of Mercy*, a 3,000 page meditation (verse by verse) on the Gospel of St. Matthew. This excerpt from his exegesis on Matthew 26:26 (*While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body."*) gives us something to think about in this year of Eucharistic Renewal.

"...from the beginning everything about the first creation was oriented by God toward a second and final creation whereby God would bestow himself as man's food...We must readily admit that *Take and eat; this is my body* is indeed outrageous, bringing us squarely before the Chestertonian (G.K. Chesterton, 1874-1936) reduction: either this is the affirmation of a madman, or it is literally true. Taken literally, and in isolation from the whole history of revelation, it is likely to provoke natural aversion and elicit repugnance at almost every level of human sensibility, rationality, and mental comfort. Jesus' words would seem to be promoting some form of masochistic cannibalism. And yet we plainly encounter Jesus' unequivocal pronouncements on the matter in the sacred text of all four evangelists, in the affirmations of the apostle Paul, in the earliest patristic documents...as well as all along the uninterrupted liturgical and doctrinal tradition of the undivided Church of both East and West...Inevitably endless attempt have been made through the ages by certain naysayers to dilute, reinterpret, accommodate, and spiritualize the Catholic and Orthodox understanding of these words from Jesus' own lips."

In next month's article, we will continue Father Simeon's exegesis, showing how St. Peter guides us to the truth of Jesus's words. Jesus was not a madman. In the Eucharist, God has "bestowed himself as man's food."
