

The words of today's gospel upend that notion that the wise and the powerful of the world will have an advantage over the rest of us when it comes to

In a sense, Jesus is thanking the Father for giving him the "burden" of powerlessness and is asking us to imitate him. If we have the trust of a child, we can discover that God's will is a weight we will gladly carry, just as Jesus did when he tells us that his (Jesus') yoke is one that is easy his burden one that is light.

Deacon Paul Audette James Martin

In this excerpt from his book Becoming Who You Are (Part IV), James Martin SJ treats a subject that all of us can relate to: the true self hidden behind all the masks and entanglements each of us wraps around it. Once one peels away all those layers and obstacles, the path to holiness becomes clear: simply be who you are: "The trajectory of Merton's own life clearly shows his own steady movement away from the false self...Merton's early journals and letters are filled with a confidence that unsuccessfully masks a deep longing for a place to belong. These feelings continue unabated until the day he enters the Trappist monastery, when he finally finds the home he has long been searching for. But even then, during his years at the abbey, even after he has become a monk, Merton continues to meditate on what kind of monk he is intended to be, as he moves closer toward being the person God intended him to be...Ultimately, he says, 'If I find Him I will find myself, and if I find my true self I will find Him.' In other words, God desires for us to be the persons we were created to be: to be simply and purely ourselves, and in this state to love God and to let ourselves be loved by God."

Welcome to St. George Religious Education Registration!

We are so excited to work with the children of our parish. We offer classes for children in grades 1-10. We prepare students for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion (typically in Grade 2), and Confirmation (typically in Grade 10).

The cost for the program is \$100 per student with a family cap of \$200. There is an additional fee of \$50 for those students in a sacramental year (1st Communion and Confirmation). As an example, if a family has 3 children in classes they would pay \$200 for their religious education fees, plus \$50 per any child making their 1st Communion or Confirmation.

Students in Grades 1-8 meet weekly, and have the option of registering for Tuesday afternoons 4:30-5:30 PM OR Sunday mornings 9:00-10:00 AM. Confirmation I & II students (typically grades 9 & 10) meet approximately once a month on Sunday mornings 11:00-12:00 PM, after attending the 10:00 AM Mass together. 



Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner

"Come to me, all vou who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light" (Mt 11:28-30). These are the last few verses of this week's Gospel, and they are powerful words for us to remember. Today, many of us have heavy yokes on our shoulders; we are working demanding jobs, trying to take care of our own physical, mental and spiritual needs, as well as those of our families and friends, and all while handling the various "unexpected surprises" that happen every day. All of these can be overwhelming sometimes, and when we begin to feel overwhelmed, the advise we often hear today is to engage in "self -care", taking some time for ourselves to recharge. Although this may be a newer phrase, the idea is certainly not new. Jesus took time away from the crowds and his friends to be alone to rest and pray. This is something we should also try to emulate when we feel overwhelmed. Take some time, ask God for the strength and endurance to overcome our current hardships, and offer up those burdens to Him.






