

From Your Pastor

This weekend is the last weekend that our seminarian for this summer, Daniel Morrissey, will be with us. He will be taking a vacation before returning to St. John's

Seminary in Brighton to begin his second year of pretheological studies for the priesthood. We wish Daniel well as he begins this new school year and pray that it will be an enriching one for him spiritually as well as academically.

The parables that Jesus shares in this week's Gospel emphasize the process of search and discovery. God's direct rule over all things might be the ultimate reality, but it is a subtle process. Recognizing it requires discernment and the ability to identify God's presence and action. Those exercising discernment in today's Gospel had already trained themselves to find what they sought. The fortune hunter knew how to discover a great treasure; the pearl merchant recognized the valuable pearl; the fishermen knew what to keep and what to discard. Similarly, those seeking God's kingdom must first train themselves to recognize it. Prayer, works of mercy and studying God's word are the training that opens one's heart to recognize God's continuous presence and action.

Here are some questions to reflect upon with this Gospel:


- 1. What role does hope play for each of the people in the parable as they seek treasure, the valuable pearl or a catch of fish?

In this excerpt from an essay published in the April 18, 2016 issue of America magazine, James Martin SJ treats some of the negatives of our day-to-day experience of Catholicism: not only our own griefs and gripes but the misperceptions and bigotries of many non-Catholics and the American media. (Part I): "I once heard some great advice for getting along in Jesuit community: 1. You're not God. 2. This isn't heaven. 3. Don't be a jerk...The first two are essential for life in general. 'You're not God' has multiple implications. First, you can't change most things, so stop trying. Second, you're not in charge, so stop acting as if you were. And third, you don't know everything, so stop acting as if you do. It brings calm, perspective and humility...The second dictum, 'This isn't heaven' can help to reduce the complaining you do...But it's that last apothegm that I wish more people remembered when they enter into public discussions: 'Don't be a jerk.' Now, I'm the first to admit that I break that rule from time to time...But today a surprising number of people think nothing of attacking people anonymously on Twitter, calling fellow politicians terrible names and maligning their integrity during debates, posting mean comments on Facebook and shouting over one another on talk shows - basically, being a jerk. And jerkiness is contagious, I think. Seeing public figures shouting on television probably encourages people to do it their private lives. At the very least, it does not encourage charitable behavior."

Welcome to St. George Religious Education Registration!

We are so excited to work with the children of our parish. We offer classes for children in grades 1-10. We prepare students for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion (typically in Grade 2), and Confirmation (typically in Grade 10).

The cost for the program is \$100 per student with a family cap of \$200. There is an additional fee of \$50 for those students in a sacramental year (1st Communion and Confirmation). As an example, if a family has 3 children in classes they would pay \$200 for their religious education fees, plus \$50 per any child making their 1st Communion or Confirmation.

Students in Grades 1-8 meet weekly, and have the option of registering for Tuesday afternoons 4:30-5:30 PM OR Sunday mornings 9:00-10:00 AM. Confirmation I & II students (typically grades 9 & 10) meet approximately once a month on Sunday mornings 11:00-12:00 PM, after attending the 10:00 AM Mass together. 

As members of the Catholic Church, we believe that, during Mass, the bread and wine used at Communion, truly become the body and blood of Jesus Christ. What is not often realized or as widely shared, is that, when we receive the host and precious blood, they take 10-15 minutes to be diluted and fully assimilated in the stomach. During these minutes, the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ resides within us.

Here is a story from the life of St. Philip Neri on the subject:

"One day while he was celebrating Mass, a man received Holy Communion and left the church early. The man appeared to have no regard for the Presence within him and so Philip Neri decided to use this opportunity as a teaching moment. He sent two altar boys with lighted candles to follow the man outside of the church. After a while, walking through the streets of Rome, the man turned around to see the altar boys still following him. Confused, the man returned to the church and asked Philip Neri why he sent the altar boys. Saint Philip Neri responded saying, "We have to pay proper respect to Our Lord, Whom you are carrying away with you. Since you neglect to adore Him, I sent two acolytes to take your place." The man was stunned by the response and resolved to be more aware of God's presence in the future."

Especially during this time of Eucharistic Renewal, may we celebrate and appreciate the awesome opportunity we have in receiving the body and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ!



Saint John Vianney

B orn near Lyon, France, this farmer's son studied for the priesthood for many years, and eventually was ordained more for his devoutness and good will than for other qualities. But he became a model parish priest in Arsen-Dombes, where he served for 40 years. He was devoted to his parishioners, and became famous for rigorous preaching and insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18 hours a day hearing the confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests.




