From Your Pastor

Throughout the Church's history, a dynamic has existed between those who want to maintain God's

house for a certain group of people who meet specific criteria and those who would open the doors wide to welcome all. The Canaanite woman in this gospel would be one of those people in the second group. In Jesus' recognition and response to her great faith, this narrative anticipates the expansion of the Church's missions to all peoples and nations. Although we understand the Church as missionary whose purpose is to bring all to salvation in Christ, all of us at times have tried to keep certain people out of the sanctuary. Many of us may not be charitable to our brother and sister Christians, let alone the rest of the world. As this gospel demonstrates, it was not always easy for the first disciples to learn this lesson. In every age Christ's followers advance this universal mission when they work to reveal God's mercy to those who are desperate for it. Even more importantly, they must be ready to recognize God's mercy in those people and places where they may not have expected to find it. Today's gospel warns against an all too-narrow account of God's mercy. Many churches have signs saying, "All are welcome," but that may be false advertising. Do we really want to pray with all people or with those who are like-minded? Is our image of a house of prayer like a garden (where the Bible begins) to which we long to return unbothered by others? We must remember that the Bible ends in a city whose image in this life is where people may come from all over to work, play, raise children, establish homes and worship. This is a description of God's city.

Here are some questions to reflect upon with this Gospel:

- Today's gospel asks you to think about the type of person you might be – one who wants to associate and pray with people who meet certain criteria or one who is open to all people? How do you break down barriers to God's mercy?
- 2. How do you prepare to recognize God at work in unexpected situations?
- 3. Has there been a time when you have felt connected to God in the midst of other people and their activities? Return to that place. What do you recall by way of sight, feel, smell, hearing or taste? How do you pray in this place?

Excerpts from an essay entitled "Here's How God Works" published in the August 29, 2005 issue of America magazine (Part II): "But there are also moments when everything works out with almost alarming grace. In April I was invited for a return trip to Lourdes with a Jesuit friend named George... George and I decided to make a side visit to Loyola, the Spanish town and birthplace of St. Ignatius, founder of the Jesuits...and here is where it became obvious, at least to me. how God can make things easy...We toured Loyola Castle... On the uppermost floor, we stumbled on the room in which St. Ignatius experienced his first conversion, while recuperating from battle injuries in 1521. In that room a French priest was just about to celebrate Mass before an ornate wooden altar. Waving us in, he invited us to join a group of pilgrims just starting a pilgrimage to Compestela. We celebrated Mass with them and proclaimed the readings in our high-school French. Afterward the priest asked us what we did back home. I'm a writer, I said, and George is a prison chaplain. He put his arms around us and smiled broadly, 'Ces deux vocations ont commence dans cette chambre.' He said to the pilgrims. These two vocations began in this room."



Welcome to St. George Religious Education Registration!

We are so excited to work with the children of our parish. We offer classes for children in grades 1-10. We prepare students for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion (typically in Grade 2), and Confirmation (typically in Grade 10).

The cost for the program is \$100 per student with a family cap of \$200. There is an additional fee of \$50 for those students in a sacramental year (1st Communion and Confirmation). As an example, if a family has 3 children in classes they would pay \$200 for their religious education fees, plus \$50 per any child making their 1st Communion or Confirmation.

Students in Grades 1-8 meet weekly, and have the option of registering for Tuesday afternoons 4:30-5:30 PM OR Sunday mornings 9:00-10:00 AM. Confirmation I & II students (typically grades 9 & 10) meet approximately once a month on Sunday mornings 11:00-12:00 PM, after attending the 10:00 AM Mass together. 




