

#### From Your Pastor

Living the Gospel means giving up a life of fantasy and following the mind of God. The challenges and results that come from such a change are the theme of this Sunday's readings. Jeremiah in the first reading served Israel's king and came from an elite family. His prophecy of invasion and exile was one that most rejected. He struggled as an outcast but remained committed to the mind of God, thus ensuring that Israel would survive such a disaster. When Jesus instructs his disciples to deny themselves, take up their cross and follow him, he is speaking to exactly the same type of life that Jeremiah lived. Disciples who live such a life often find that they want more of it because they feel a presence of God in both soul and body. The responsorial psalm speaks of a soul that thirst for God like a desert does for rain. Satisfying this desire requires an offering of the entire self. In the second reading St. Paul speaks of this kind of life. Those who offer soul and body as a living sacrifice will understand the mind of God and have a life filled with abundant grace.

Here are some questions for reflection:

- 1. Are there immature ways that Christ has asked you to leave behind?
- 2. What dreams has God shared with you? How can you fulfill
- 3. As you read (and possibly reread) this weekend's Gospel, how does Peter's thinking need to change?

As followers of Jesus, we must always be vigilant, strengthening our faith, practicing virtue, and turning to the Lord in prayer. In the smaller things of everyday life, we practice the love of Christ, bringing peace to every moment we can. We pick up the cross, making whatever sacrifice we must to follow and serve him. Don't fail! The battle is not yet done!



#### Deacon Paul Audette James Martin

The spirituality of Fr. James Martin was profoundly influenced by the spirituality of Thomas Merton, There was a moment in Merton's life that profoundly changed the way he looked at the world. Merton describes that moment in his book Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander. During a time when he found himself in a period of caustic judgmentalism of all those around him and a quick contempt for his fellow humans, Merton writes: In Louisville, at the corner of Fourth and Walnut, in the center of the shopping district. I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all those people, that they were mine and I theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. It was like waking from a dream of separateness, of spiritual self-isolation in a special world, the world of renunciation and supposed holiness...This sense of liberation from an illusory difference was such a relief and such a joy to me that I almost laughed out loud...I have the immense joy of being man, a member of a race in which God Himself became incarnate. In the coming weeks. Fr. Martin will comment on how this insight can be the basis for how we live our lives.



## Welcome to St. George Religious Education Registration!

We are so excited to work with the children of our parish. We offer classes for children in grades 1-10. We prepare students for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion (typically in Grade 2), and Confirmation (typically in Grade 10).

The cost for the program is \$100 per student with a family cap of \$200. There is an additional fee of \$50 for those students in a sacramental year (1st Communion and Confirmation). As an example, if a family has 3 children in classes they would pay \$200 for their religious education fees, plus \$50 per any child making their 1st Communion or Confirmation.

Students in Grades 1-8 meet weekly, and have the option of registering for Tuesday afternoons 4:30-5:30 PM OR Sunday mornings 9:00-10:00 AM. Confirmation I & II students (typically grades 9 & 10) meet approximately once a month on Sunday mornings 11:00-12:00 PM, after attending the 10:00 AM Mass together. 
