

### Welcome to St. George Religious Education Registration!

We are so excited to work with the children of our parish. We offer classes for children in grades 1-10. We prepare students for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion (typically in Grade 2), and Confirmation (typically in Grade 10). The cost for the program is \$100 per student with a family cap of \$200. There is an additional fee of \$50 for those students in a sacramental year (1st Communion and Confirmation). As an example, if a family has 3 children in classes they would pay \$200 for their religious education fees, plus \$50 per any child making their 1st Communion or Confirmation.

Students in Grades 1-8 meet weekly, and have the option of registering for Tuesday afternoons 4:30-5:30 PM OR Sunday mornings 9:00-10:00 AM. Confirmation I & II students (typically grades 9 & 10) meet approximately once a month on Sunday mornings 11:00-12:00 PM, after attending the 10:00 AM Mass together. 





#### **Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner**

This week's readings center on a similar theme, that being love of neighbor. The first reading says that we are intermediaries between God and those around us, that we should strive to bring others closer to God because we know Him and hear what He commands. The second reading recalls the second Great Commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The Gospel instructs us to settle our disputes with others quickly and in private, so as not to create scandal.

We are approaching 22 years since the horrific events of 9/11. Thousands of people were killed on that tragic day, and countless more live were, and still are impacted. It is very easy to remember the hate, violence, and destruction from that day, and it is important to remember the tragedy, in hopes that we can prevent such things from happening again. However, we must also make it a point to remember the self-less love that so many people shared that day, trying to save others' lives and offering anything they could to do so. All those first responders, policemen, firefighters, and other passers-by who wanted to do what they could to help. They certainly lived out the Great Commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. "That day was an act of inspiration for each of us on how normal everyday people can make such an impact in the lives of others through love.
