



I recently read a piece of news from the local newspaper of the Diocese of Worcester. The article refers to the synthesis report that has been submitted to the Vatican to be included in the Worldwide Synod.

The synthesis says; In the U.S. alone during the diocesan phase more than 30,000 listening sessions ... involving an estimated 700,000 participants ... took place. These listening sessions revealed that:

- U.S. Catholics seek a more welcoming church in which their "lived reality" is prioritized over rules and regulations.
- continue to feel wounded by the clergy abuse crisis, and
- desire lifelong spiritual, pastoral and catechetical formation as disciples.

I am amazed and delighted that the incredible power of listening has been set in motion by God's Holy Spirit. I am grateful to Fr. Niccolls, Bonnie Moran and our Spiritual Growth Ministry for adding our voices to this hopeful process.

As many of you know, the purpose of the Synod is not just to produce more documents, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, and to learn from one another.

As Lent begins, I look forward to these days of hope, healing, serving and growing together.

## Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God, in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone". On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving: Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all.

How can I become more loving and merciful during this Lenten season? Will growing in my relationship with Jesus lead me along the path of greater transformation?

A recent article in "America" magazine written by Joyce Rupp, O.S.M., author and speaker, tells the story of her personal growth in her relationship with Jesus. Joyce took to heart the words of a teacher who encouraged her 7 year old students to consider Jesus as a friend-someone to whom they could talk. Performing her daily farm task of feeding the chickens, Joyce found happiness sharing her thoughts and feelings with her friend, Jesus.

As her "perception of the divine" grew she fostered her relationship with Jesus and found peace and direction for how to live. Meditating on the Gospel passages of the Lenten season and relating them to daily life was enriching for Joyce. As a sister Joyce attended Jesuit retreats and learned and integrated the Ignatian method of placing herself among the people in the Gospel scenes. She was "absorbed in the spiritual energy of the one who healed and counseled the people". This process gave Sr. Joyce "insight and courage" to relate to Jesus in a more personal manner.

The teachings of Jesus are transformative messages which "provide counsel". He gave advice about the attitudes we hold regarding others. A few of the guidelines Sr. Joyce learned by placing herself in the Gospel scenes include: cease comparing; be humble; remember what genuine love is; move toward those who treat you as an enemy; stand with and support marginalized persons and let go of what keeps you from being kind-hearted.

Recognizing the virtues so present in Jesus, Lent can be a time to grow, as Sr. Joyce Rupp did, leading us to a deepening of our ongoing personal transformation. May we during this special Lenten time move closer to the person of love we are called to be.

## Diocese of Worcester Lenten Regulations Guidelines for Fast and Abstinence

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older starting Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty-nine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices. For more information on Lenten Regulations visit:
