From Your Pastor

Today we begin our solemn observance of Holy Week when we recall our savior Jesus Christ's passion and death which lead to his resurrection at Easter. Our celebration of these events begins on Thursday evening with the Easter Triduum. On Holy Thursday, the first day of the Triduum, we recall Jesus sharing his body and blood in bread and wine in the upper room. Like so many other parishes, we will reenact the washing of the disciples' feet during this liturgy. At the end of this Mass, after the procession of the Blessed Sacrament throughout the church, all altar coverings and sanctuary decorations and appointments are removed, symbolizing the fact that Christ was stripped of his garments upon his arrest. After the Mass, you are invited to stay in church for a while in adoration to the Blessed Sacrament and silently reflect upon these holy mysteries. On Good Friday we will participate in the reading of the Passion according to St. John, venerate the cross, pray for the Church and the whole world and receive Holy Communion (the Body of Christ). At the Easter Vigil we will hear selected readings following the story of God's creation of the world, the deliverance of God's people from Egypt, readings from the prophets, an epistle from St. Paul to the Romans and the Gospel accounts of Jesus rising from the grave to redeem all people. The Easter Vigil concludes with the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

All three of these major liturgies on Thursday, Friday and Saturday will be celebrated at 7:30 P.M. I remind you once again that there will be NO 4:00 P.M. Mass on Saturday, March 30th, since the first liturgy of Easter is the Vigil Liturgy. Masses on Easter Sunday, March 31st, will be at 8:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. There will be no confessions on Saturday, March 30th.

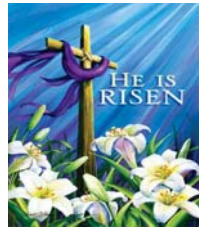

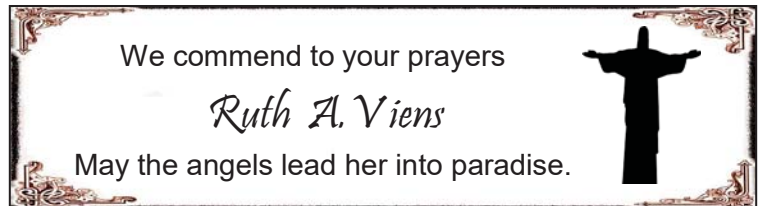

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

March 21, 2024

Each year, the Holy Father asks Catholic parishes around the world to take up a **Good Friday Collection** to support Christians in the Holy Land. Christians living in the Holy Land not only struggle to live their faith and worship in their parishes - they are also the stewards of the sacred places that are currently without pilgrims due to the continuing conflict in Gaza and Israel.

As was the case during the pandemic, pilgrims cannot travel on pilgrimages to these sacred sites. This places a terrible burden on the small and fragile Christian presence on the Holy Land. This annual collection supports the work of the Franciscans in the sacred shrines and allows them to continue to minister to the parishes, provide formation and education in communities and schools, and care for the basic needs of the Christian faithful who call the Holy Land their home. Your support is more essential than ever to their ministry.

At the beginning of Lent, I invited you to participate in the Way of the Cross in a local parish church. This is such a powerful way for us to recall the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ during Lent. Christians in the Holy Land are faced with the particular challenge of bringing their own suffering to the cross every day as they witness to the faith. The Latin Patriarch of the Holy Land has been a voice for Christians living not just in Jerusalem, but also in Jordan, Syria and Lebanon.

Please be generous in this year's Good Friday Collection in your parish. I invite you to visit www.myfranciscan.org to learn more about the good work made possible thanks to your response to this pontifical collection. With your help, the Franciscans can continue to be a light of hope to Christians who continue to struggle in the Holy Land.

Hope For Housing Cards Help Prevent Family Homelessness

Hope for Housing is a non-profit program developed by our parishioner Matt Ryan. Matt has left us with this legacy which utilizes the collective buying power of 30 congregations to raise money for the prevention of family homelessness.

These Gift Cards for local retailers, including Big Y, CVS, Dunkin' Donuts, Hannaford, Panera, Shaws, Stop & Shop Target, Starbucks, and TJ Max are purchased in bulk, which in turn are sold to members of participating congregations who receive the full value of the card. The retailers donate 2-10% of all sales to the Hope for Housing program. Mustard Seed Catholic Worker: Men's lighter spring jackets and T-Shirts are needed. Jeans and sweatpants are especially welcome.

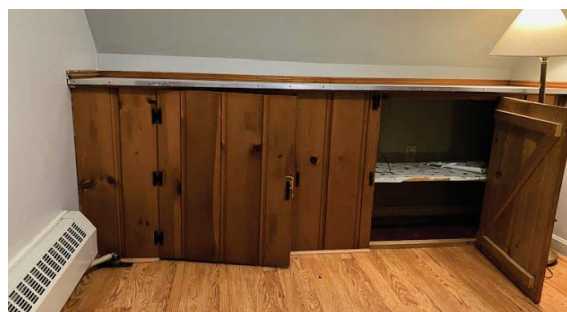
IHN Family Shelter: There is a need for Juice Boxes and healthy snacks. In an effort to reduce the use of paper towels, small hand towels are needed.

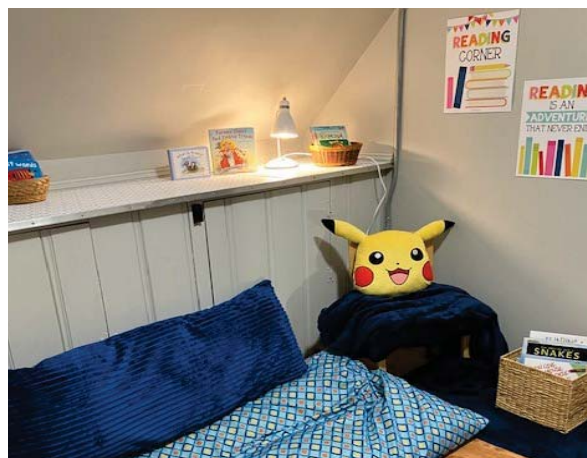

Spiritual Growth Ministry Corner

This weekend we relive the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna" and palm branches being waved and strewn in His path. Praise for Jesus was loud and clear.

However, during the next few days Jesus suffered circumstances which must have resulted in painful human emotions. Not only was He "true God", He was "true man" as well, experiencing a range of human emotions with which we can identify.

Knowing the ordeal ahead Jesus participated in a meal with His disciples and friends. He instituted the Eucharist and shared its meaning with those present - a meaning which has been passed forward to us through the ages.

Following the shared meal Jesus and some of His disciples walked to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus needed to pray to His Father. He moved away from His disciples and prostrated Himself as He said, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me" (Matthew). Surely a response of agony in the face of pain and death!

Returning to His disciples He found them asleep. A disappointed Jesus said, "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?" Another human response of one craving the support and understanding of friends and sadly, not finding it. How lonely He must have felt!

Betrayed by Judas for thirty pieces of silver Jesus was identified to the arresting soldiers by a kiss from Judas - one of His close followers. Betrayal by a friend must have elicited deep pain!

In the courtyard where soldiers and onlookers were warming themselves by a fire, Peter, the rock on which Jesus would build His church, denied Jesus three times. Another human emotion - a feeling of abandonment!

As Jesus was submitted to the cruelty of crucifixion a few of the people closest to Him were present. Where were those He healed and to whom He brought comfort? Did He question if He had reached the people He had come to save? Did the people He met along the way accept who He was? Not only might He have been questioning - He was at the same time experiencing the emotion of fear based on the pain He was enduring.

The range of emotions within Jesus during His final days are not foreign to us. Within the circumstances of life we experience sadness, loneliness, betrayal, abandonment and fear when faced with our physical or emotional pain or the pain of those we love. We can take courage from the fact that Jesus understands the circumstances which trigger these emotions. We may initially cry out as Jesus did, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

As we struggle to cope, to make a situation better, or come to terms with the inevitable we will hopefully turn to the faith and courage Jesus has passed on to us and be able to say the words Jesus said to His Father, "Not as I will, but as You will."
