

From Your Pastor

On behalf of our Parish Staff, I extend to all of you God's Blessings, manifested in our risen Lord, Jesus Christ, in this Easter Season!

The Resurrection of Jesus is a mystery that we may not yet fully understand nor appreciate. The disciples of Jesus did not fully understand either but, as we see in the beloved disciple, there is the moment when one can see and believe. My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Easter 2024

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ brought profound joy and hope to the early Church. That joy was particularly pronounced because it followed the shock and gloom of Good Friday when Christ's death seemed to dash all hope.

Two millennia later, a world tragically marred by war, injustice, and division desperately needs the transforming joy of Easter. Our commemoration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ again brings us the certain hope that, in the end, the righteousness, peace, and joy of God's Kingdom, will prevail. We need the hope and confidence flowing from Christ's Triumph not only at Easter but every day. And we can have it.

At every Mass we celebrate the memorial of Christ's saving Passion and wondrous Resurrection. This is more that just calling to mind the greatest events of history. It is making those events, their saving effects, and Christ Himself truly present to continue the redemption of our weary world.

In this final year of our National Eucharistic Revival, we would do well to reflect upon some of the actions and gestures at Mass that remind us of the mysteries of our faith made present in the Eucharist. Just as God's Son was truly born of the Virgin, Christ truly becomes present in the Eucharist after the priest calls down the Holy Spirit over the gifts and pronounces Christ's words, "This is my Body." "This is My Blood." Just as Christ was lifted up on the Cross and died by the shedding of His Blood to give glory to His Father, at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, we offer all glory and honor to the Father when the priest lifts up the Body and Blood of Christ separately and apart (representing His death). Right before Communion, a small piece of the consecrated Host is placed in the Chalice, reuniting His Body and Blood (representing His Resurrection).

I pray that you and your family are renewed in your Christian joy and hope this Easter and that joy and hope are strengthened and deepened each Sunday at Mass.

Prayer Before or After Mass



ST. PAUL CENTER FOR BIBLICAL THEOLOGY

Easter Sunday: Acts 10:34, 37-43, Psalms 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23, Colossians 3:1-4, John 20:1-9

The tomb was empty. In the early morning darkness of that first Easter, there was only confusion for Mary Magdalene and the other disciples. But as the daylight spread, they saw the dawning of a new creation.

At first they didn't understand the Scripture, today's Gospel tells us. We don't know which precise Scripture texts they were supposed to understand. Perhaps it was the sign of Jonah, who rose from the belly of the great fish after three days (see Jonah 1:17). Or maybe Hosea's prophecy of Israel's restoration from exile (see Hosea 6:2). Perhaps it was the psalmist who rejoiced that God had not abandoned him to the nether world (see Psalm 16:9-10).

Whichever Scripture it was, as the disciples bent down into the tomb, they saw and they believed. What did they see? Burial shrouds in an empty tomb. The stone removed from the tomb. Seven times in nine verses we hear that word - "tomb."

What did they believe? That God had done what Jesus said He would do - raised Him up on the third day (see Mark 9:31; 10:34).

What they saw and believed, they bore witness to, as today's First Reading tells us. Peter's speech is a summary of the gospels - from Jesus' baptism in the Jordan to His hanging on a tree (see Deuteronomy 21:22-23), to His rising from the dead.

We are children of the apostles, born into the new world of their witness. Our lives are now "hidden with Christ in God," as today's Epistle says. Like them, we gather in the morning on the first day of the week - to celebrate the Eucharist, the feast of the empty tomb.

We rejoice that the stones have been rolled away from our tombs, too. Each of us can shout, as we do in today's Psalm: "I shall not die, but live." They saw and believed. And we await the day they promised would come - when we, too, "will appear with Him in glory."

Happy Easter! This a joyous day and holy season!

Pope John Paul II is often quoted as saying "We are an Easter people and Alleluia (or Hallelujah in Hebrew) is our song". While he may have been paraphrasing St. Augustine, the message is an important one for all of us.

Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead to save all of us! While we know that we will face many struggles throughout our lives here on earth, we also know that we can strive to obtain eternal happiness in heaven.

So, now, go ahead. Say "Alleluia", sing "Alleluia", "Praise the Lord"! It's time to celebrate! Enjoy a very blessed Easter! And the celebration continues as the Easter season lasts until Pentecost (May 19th this year).
