FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



Dear Parents,



We are now in the holiest part of the year and as you prepare to reflect on the events leading up to Easter Sunday, I am asking that you please dedicate some time with your child to sit down and have a serious conversation about how much was sacrificed for us. Jesus paid the price for all of us, not just some of us. Our God is so loving that no matter what we do, He will still love us and not one of us is any more important than another. I say this because the past few weeks I have been listening to some very upset parents and staff members who are truly saddened by some of the choices being made by some of our students. These are great young people, who many of us have watched grow since they were in PreK. Understandably, at this time of year, many of our children have "spring fever" are ready to move on, especially our 8th graders. Recently, though, we are hearing more and

more about verbal bullying and teasing taking place. Often, this happens outside of school or involves technology and/or social media. Please see below regarding communication and our Social Media Policy. Parents look to us as educators for answers. When we talk to them, they often are unaware of what their child is doing or don't want to believe he/she is capable of treating others in this way. We cannot make a difference by ourselves, no matter what program we use, how many times we attend Mass or how much religion we teach. The students are very aware of what is right or wrong, they are just not applying it to real situations. This is where we need your help and need to be working together as a team.

This behavior is happening across all grade levels and often goes unreported at school. Please talk to your child about standing up for what is right, even if they are worried about retribution. The "bystanders" are the majority. I think of all those that could have spoken up for our Savior, yet stood back. You have chosen to give your child the gift of a Catholic education, which many can't do because of limited spots or finances. If we can't work together to help these children understand the importance of empathy or the choices they make and right vs. wrong, then we are not fulfilling our mission. This cannot be the duty of the school alone. The administrators and counselors, along with the teachers have been meeting with groups of children, classes and grade levels to address behavioral concerns. We ask that you as parents reinforce the message at home. Stand up, don't remain silent when others talk negatively about each other, adults or students. We need to model the behavior we expect our children and students to reflect. I encourage you to take some time to ask your child about who might need their help and role-play situations with the younger students. Many times students participate in bringing others down because they are afraid of getting picked on themselves or feel like the person "deserves it" for things they have done to others. That doesn't make it right! Our biggest mistake is in thinking our children are not capable of this. If you need help or guidance as to how to approach your child or deal with a situation that involves the school, please reach out to us. We are all in this together! You have a very important job to do as your child's "first teacher" and parenting is never easy. These are the formative years where we have a small window of opportunity to make a big difference. Thank you for considering this and for all the support you provide. As partners, we share the same goal of forming future saints and I truly hope that when we all come back after the break, we will be renewed and ready to do God's will.

Have a blessed Easter and remember, no school on Good Friday or Easter Monday!

A discernment process is one that allows the Holy Spirit to guide the truthful outcome needed for the success and growth of a community.

The following persons may not be considered as candidates for the School Board:

- Spouses, siblings, or children of members of the School Board;
- Employees of the School or Parish or their spouses, children, or siblings;
- PTO Officers (other than the PTO President(s), who shall be an ex-officio member of the School Board) or such Officers' spouses;
- Board members or professional educators of another school or school system.
