FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents,

We are almost all in and it's great to see students in classes now through 8th grade. Tomorrow night is our first Parent Information Night (PIN) for all PreK-4th Grade parents. You will receive an email with a ZOOM link tomorrow for a 6:30 p.m. start during which we will explain how the evening will work. After a brief introduction, parents will be invited to three sessions that allow you to hear from your child's teacher(s), Mrs. Gomez, Assistant Principal and Mrs. NIckel, Counselor on guidance and social emotional needs, and myself and Mrs. Murray, Nurse on our current COVID-19 procedures. We also have videotaped messages from our beloved Pastor, Fr. Drew and the auxiliary staff (music, art, spanish, PE) available as well. We ask that you please take a moment to attend all three live ZOOM sessions beginning at 7:00/7:30 and 8:00 p.m. so that you will be fully informed.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of our great volunteers that have been helping with carpool and lunches. Your support is amazing and allows us to be with the students and keep our Saints community safe. What has come up repeatedly from the medical professionals we have consulted is the concern about the upcoming holiday weekend and families not following guidelines recommended by the CDC. We are working tirelessly during the school day to do our best keeping students apart, reworking schedules and disinfecting everything in order to avoid contamination and the spread of the virus. This could all be for nothing if this same diligence is not being observed outside of the school day. Many of our families continue to stay home and isolate due to health reasons and we must act together as a trinity in order to avoid anyone becoming ill and possibly having to quarantine cohorts, or worse; causing us to close again. The true effect of us opening and how everyone observes the holiday weekend will be noticeable two weeks from now, according to the Health Department. If families are not distancing, wearing masks and taking precautions over Labor Day, we could increase the numbers of cases in our area and potentially defeat all the efforts that have been taken to get to this point. I also want to ask that if you DO travel and/or end up in a situation with a higher risk, that you consider keeping your child home for a couple of weeks. Students can switch temporarily to remote and not miss a beat. This is the expected procedure if anyone in your household becomes sick as well. We ask that you please email us at COVID-19@stlaurence.org to give us any information regarding symptoms in your child or family members, whether they are lab-confirmed positive or not. It will take all of us working together to keep school in session and to make sure that our staff, students and families are protected. Please remember to complete the daily screening questionnaire every morning before arriving at school with your child(ren). The sticker we have been handing out at carpool is the QR code with the two survey questions and you can stick it on your carpool tag for convenience. You are also welcome to use the link we sent out earlier if that is easier. If any of your answers are "yes" pertaining to your child or any member of your family, your child should not attend school and you are asked to notify us immediately via COVID-19@staurence.org. If you are asked to quarantine or bring a doctor's note, we appreciate your understanding of these guidelines as we all work together to keep our Saints safe.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

We hope your child is getting adjusted to his/her learning environments. In our last counselor's corner, we suggested some strategies to start the school year off successfully. We want to encourage students to take breaks, often known as brain breaks, when they are doing their school work or homework. These are short, energizing

bursts of activity that boost blood flow, send oxygen to the brain, and help kids better retain information. These breaks can help students to refocus and destress.

Here is one example of a brain break from Edutopia: Activities That Prime the Brain for Learning by Lori DeSautels

Balancing tree: Have students place both feet solidly on the ground. They should slowly lift one foot and touch it to the inside of the other calf or upper leg, and raise their arms in the air over their head. Next have them wave their arms as if they were a tree with its branches blowing in the wind. Have them switch legs and repeat this motion. Next ask them to show a tree in a rainstorm and to notice how the trunk of the tree—their body—stays strong: Even though they might wobble, they're still standing tall.

FROM MRS. NICKEL:

It is so wonderful to have so many smiling faces back in the classrooms at school! For the students doing remote learning, I intend to put activities online through each grade level's platform (Seesaw/google classroom) to continue to develop SEL skills both at home and in the classroom. I will be available via ZOOM during PIN night this Thursday September 3, and look forward to meeting you there!

FROM MRS. SCHURMAN:

Please be sure your child has joined Mrs. Schurman's Guidance Google Classroom. There is one google classroom for each grade. The codes were emailed to the students and parents on Monday, August 24th. The homeroom teachers have shared the grade level codes as well. The google classrooms will be another means that I can share information with students directly. I look forward to seeing you for Middle School PIN on September 10th.
